1. Course Title: Tropical Medicine, Community Health Care and Research

2. Duration: A 3-week course

3. Background and Rationale:

Thailand has achieved certain health targets in terms of developing health care infrastructures, strengthening human resources for health, providing universal access to healthcare services, initiating a number of health promotion programs, creating essential health and medical knowledge and ultimately, improving health status of Thai people. 5.4 Assignments:

5.4.1 Country Report: Participants will be expected to prepare and then present a country report using report format according to AITC.

5.4.2 Reading Assignments/Course materials: A reading resource kit and worksheets will be provided along with website links for prior core reading preparation.

5.5.3 Project Assignments: Participants will be expected to prepare examples of community health issues from their own practices in order to develop action plan or research proposal.

5.5.4 Others: Participants will be expected to prepare a community health research/project proposal and data collecting tools prompt to be implemented in their practice.

6. Number of Participants: Approximately 40 persons

7. Participants' Criteria: Health personnel currently working in the community health sectors; e.g., doctors, nurses, pharmacists, public health officers, administrators who met English requirement.

8. Invited Country: Participants from countries throughout the globe.

9. Venue: via Zoom meeting for synchronous online sessions and the sessions will also be available on KKUMEDX online platform for those who are unable to attend synchronous online sessions or those who want to review the lessons.

10. Expected Results:

10.1 Participants will increase their knowledge and skills for developing and implementing effective community health services in response to anticipated community health challenges as well as enhance their capacity for translating community health research findings into routine practice.

10.2 International linkage and collaboration between Thailand and participants' countries will be enhanced.

11. Evaluation:

11.1 Each participant has to present and submit their research/project proposal to the organizing committee at the end of the course.

11.2 In order to complete the course, participants need to attend at least 90% of the classes.

11.3 Group debriefing with participants at the end of the course will be conducted; anonymous feedback from participants in regard to the course objectives, clarity of the course materials, appropriateness of the course delivery, course usefulness, ease of translation of the course experiences into day-to-day practice, course's strengths and weaknesses, and recommendations for enhancing future courses.
