- **1. Course Title**: The New Normal with Sustainable Community–based Eco–tourism Development under 4Ps model for ACMECS

3. Background and Rational

Thailand has offered the various kinds of tourism which the community based ecotourism has become one of the most interesting tourism types throughout the country. They are both managed by the community itself, management decisions are made by local people and profits directly go to the community and often marketed and organized by private travel companies and government protected areas under the wide concept of sustainable tourism such as:
