5. Background and Rational:

The Master of Primary Healthcare Management is an international program designed to equip learners with the knowledge and skills necessary for analyzing, researching, and synthesizing new knowledge in primary healthcare management. The program's focus is on improving local health systems through primary healthcare, enabling participants to address community health issues and create equitable access to quality health services.

The curriculum supports learners in identifying policies and management models that strengthen primary care systems at both local and national levels. It emphasizes research processes, analytical thinking, and creative problem-solving, preparing students to become independent researchers capable of improving health management and contributing to health system development locally and internationally.

Graduates are expected to play a key role in healthcare education and the management of local health systems, using primary healthcare principles to promote universal access to quality healthcare and improve the overall quality of life. The program aims to foster leadership and innovation, preparing professionals to advance primary healthcare management on both national and global stages.

- 1) Exhibits the discipline and honesty, behave according to morals and ethics of personal and professional practice.
- 2) Explain the theoretical concepts and the interconnection of various fields of knowledge in primary health care management.

- 3) Evaluates information and its sources critically and incorporates selected information into his or her own learning base and research to solve the problems associated with primary health care management system.
- 4) Be able to working as a team with effective interpersonal communication skills to establish and enhance personal and work-based relationships.
- 5) Perform the statistical analysis and its interpretation, communication and presentation with appropriate information technology.

- 2) Students must complete courses as stated in the curriculum, at least 24 credits of course work with a minimum CUM-GPA of 3.00 and thesis (12 credits).
- Students must meet the English Competence Standard of Graduate Students, Mahidol University defined by the Faculty of Graduate Studies, Mahidol University.
- 4) Students must participate and pass in skill development activities of the Graduate Studies, Mahidol University.
- 5) Students must submit, present theses, pass the public oral thesis defense and approve by the thesis examination committee which was appointed by the Faculty of Graduate Studies, Mahidol University.
- 6) Parts of the thesis required to be published or accepted in national or international academic databased journal according to the annoucement of the office of higher

education commission or present in international conference with proceeding according to the Faculty of Graduate Studies, Mahidol University.

9. Applicant Qualifications

- 1) Holding a Bachler degree in health sciences and other related subjects from the university are accredited by the Office of the Higher Education Commission.
- 2) Having a cumulative GPA not less than 2.50.
- 3) Have an English Proficiency Examination score as the requirement of The Faculty of Graduate Studies, Mahidol University. The minimum English proficiency standards as follows:
 - IELTS 5.0 (Wring =5.0, Speaking = 5.0)
 - TOEFL-iBT 64 (Writing =17, Speaking = 15)
 - MU GRAD Plus 70 (Writing = 10, Speaking = 10)
 - MU ELT 84 (Writing = 10, Speaking = 10)
- 4) Applicants with different qualification mentioned in the above 2) and 3) may be considered for admission by the Program Administrative Committee and the Dean of the Faculty of Graduate Studies.
