

Chulvat Narinhrangura currently serves as the Director-General of the Thailand International Cooperation Agency (TICA), bringing with him a distinguished career in diplomacy and international relations.

He holds a Master's degree in Economics from Central Michigan University, USA, which he earned in 1993. His extensive diplomatic career began shortly thereafter, with his first posting as Third Secretary in the International Economic Policy Division of the Department of International Economic Affairs in 1994.

Coming from a proud diplomatic family, Chulvat was inspired by the legacy of his late father, who served as Thailand's ambassador in various countries. This strong familial foundation in diplomacy has deeply influenced his career path and commitment to international service.

In 1996, he was appointed Second Secretary at the Royal Thai Embassy in Nairobi, Kenya, followed by a significant role as First Secretary at Thailand's Permanent Mission to the United Nations in New York from 1998. From 2015, he served as Director of the South Pacific Division within the Department of American and South Pacific Affairs, further broadening his regional expertise.

In 2019, he was appointed Deputy Consul-General at the Royal Thai Consulate in Vancouver, Canada, before taking on the critical role of Minister at the Royal Thai Embassy in Tel Aviv from 2021 to 2024. In this capacity, he managed complex diplomatic relations amid dynamic geopolitical challenges.
