

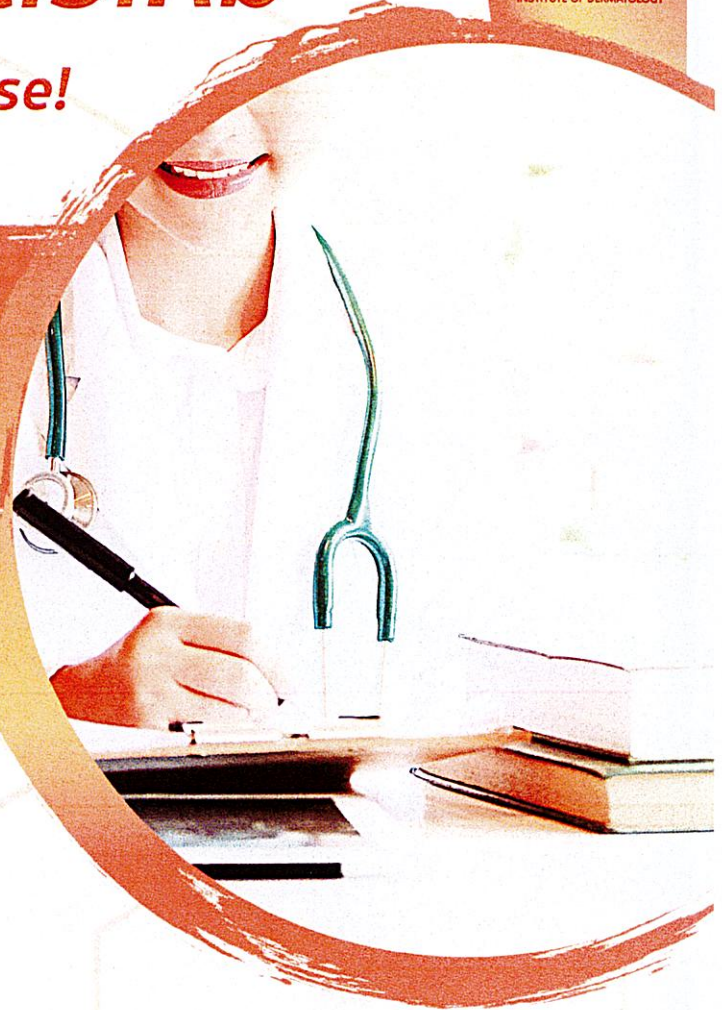

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The Institute of Dermatology, Thailand, has been a leading center for skin disease control and dermatological education for over 50 years. Established as a hub for both clinical care and specialist training, it has played a vital role in advancing dermatological practice in the region.

This international training course was first launched in 1984 as a collaborative between the Royal Thai Government and the Government of Japan. It successfully operated for 36 years, training numerous international participants, before being paused for five years due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Now relaunched with a revised and modernized curriculum, the course incorporates advancements in dermatology to align with current clinical standards and practices, ensuring its continued relevance and impact in global dermatological training.

Course Overview

This program is specifically designed for internationally qualified medical doctors (MDs) who are interested in the field of dermatology and aspire to specialize as dermatologists. The curriculum offers a comprehensive blend of academic and practical training, covering the following core components:

- Laboratory Techniques and Practices
- Dermatosurgery
- Aesthetic Dermatology

OBJECTIVE

The program is designed to provide comprehensive education in both fundamental and advanced dermatology, aligned with international standards. The ultimate goal is to enhance the quality of public health services in dermatology by equipping participants with the knowledge and skills necessary for modern clinical practice.

This intensive, one-year academic training program also aims to serve physicians from Thailand and other countries, particularly those in the Asia-Pacific region, fostering regional collaboration in dermatological care.

Graduates will be equipped to serve their communities as dermatologists. They will possess knowledge in dermatological science, diagnostic capabilities, managing skin diseases, including dermatosurgery and aesthetic dermatology.

Class Regulations

1. Class Committee Formation

Participants must select a class leader and committee within the first month. The committee will oversee both scientific and social class activities and must include a Leader, Deputy, and Secretary.

2. Teaching Evaluation

Feedback on teaching at the end of the class is encouraged to help improve teaching quality.

3. Course Evaluation

A course evaluation will be requested at the end of the one-year program to support improvements in both academic content and administrative processes.

4. Name Badge

A name badge (cost: 500 THB) must be worn at all times within the IOD for identification and entry purposes. Badges are available from TTO (non-refundation).

5. Assigned Seating

Participants must sit in their assigned seats during class sessions.

"Please keep the lecture and common rooms clean and tidy at all times."

6. Electronic Devices

Use of communication devices (e.g., mobile phones, tablets) is not allowed during class.

Phones must be set to silent mode to avoid disruption.

7. Phone Etiquette

Talking on the phone during class is prohibited.

8. Personal Belongings

Do not leave personal items unattended in lecture rooms, OPD rooms, or common areas. IOD is not responsible for lost items. If anything is lost, report it immediately to the security guard and inform TTO.

9. Food and Beverages

Food is not allowed in lecture or OPD rooms. Use the common room during breaks. Drinks are permitted.

10. Dress Code

Participants must maintain proper hygiene and attire. Unacceptable clothing includes sandals (except for traditional/national dress), jeans, and skirts that are too short. Hair should be neat.

11. White Gown

One white coat will be provided for official hours.

Additional coats may be ordered at the participant's own expense.

12. Personal Hygiene

Due to Thailand's hot and humid climate, participants are advised to shower daily with antibacterial soap, use antiperspirants, and maintain good oral hygiene.

Clothes should be clean and freshly laundered at least twice a week.

13. Cultural Etiquette

- Do not touch another person's head or place your feet on tables.
- Male participants must not touch female participants without consent.
- Always ask for permission before examining a patient's head or body.

14. Photography and Video Recording

Taking photos or recording videos during classes is not allowed.

Requests for patient photos for academic purposes must be submitted to TTO.

15. Field Visits to Other Hospitals

Buses for OPD visits depart around 8:00–8:30 AM (exact time will be announced). Be punctual and ready at the ground floor, in front of the reception counter.

Inform the class leader and assistants in advance if you are unable to attend.

16. Classroom and Facilities (19th Floor)

- Lecture rooms are open from 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM.
- Facilities include cold water, an electric kettle, refrigerator, and microwave.
- Prayer room, common room, and lockers are available.

Locker keys are provided by TTO.

"Keep rooms and equipment clean after use. The last person to leave must turn off the air conditioner, kettle, microwave, and lights."

17. Meals

Lunch can be purchased at cafeterias or shops near IOD, including Rajavithi Hospital, Queen Sirikit National Institute of Child Health, the Faculty of Tropical Medicine, the Faculty of Public Health, and opposite IOD.

18. Health and Illness Precautions

If experiencing symptoms such as coughing, wear a face mask as a standard precaution. In case of severe illness, take an ATK test and notify the appropriate personnel for sick leave.

Sick Leave

18.1 Contact TTO for support if ill. IOD does not cover medical expenses—participants must have health insurance or pay for treatment themselves.

18.2 Submit a sick leave request form to the Director via TTO on the first day following your absence.

18.3 A medical certificate must be submitted if the illness lasts more than three consecutive days.

Business Leave

Submit a completed business leave form to the Director at least three days in advance. Leave is permitted only after approval.

19. Letters of Recommendation

To request a letter of recommendation, contact TTO at least two weeks in advance. Payment should be made at the Finance and Accounting Office on the 19th floor.

20. Damage Guarantee

A refundable deposit of 3,000 THB must be submitted within the first month at the Finance and Accounting Office (17th floor). The full amount will be reimbursed upon completion of training, provided no damage has occurred.

21. Alumni Association Membership

Participants are encouraged to join the Institute of Dermatology Alumni Association for future networking and academic opportunities.
