9. To be responsible for the administrative work of the Board or to perform other acts and things prescribed in this Act or other laws or as assigned by the Board.

**Third Country Training Programme (TCTP) JFY 2023 on
Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Instructors Course
Regional Training for Pre-Hospital Emergency Care in CLMV**

The Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Instructors Course, as a part of the Third Country Training Programme JFY 2022-2024 on Regional Training for Pre-Hospital Emergency Care in CLMV, is conducted by the Government of Thailand and the Government of Japan as a part of their Technical Cooperation Scheme.

The course arrangements are set up by the National Institute for Emergency Medicine (NIEM), in collaboration with the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Thailand through the Thailand International Cooperation Agency (TICA).

Course Title

Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Instructors Course

Purpose

to provide the participants with the required knowledge, resources, and skills to effectively deliver quality education and trainings for becoming emergency medical technicians.

Anticipated Benefits

At the end of the Course, the participants are expected to;

1. Gain knowledge and understanding on essential components and system for promoting education for becoming EMTs;
2. Gain knowledge and understanding on educational concepts, theories, basic psychology of learning and instructional preparation for providing education for EMTs;
3. Gain knowledge and understanding on how to develop a mechanism for evaluating the effectiveness of an education program;
4. Be able to plan and develop EMT training programs in their own contexts.

Venue

The Training Course will be held at NIEM's training facilities, Thailand.

Duration

The Course will be held for ten (10) days excluding weekends.

Invited Countries and/or Organizations

The governments of the following countries will be invited to nominate applicant(s) to attend the Course: Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar and Vietnam.

Number of Expected Participants

The number of participants from the invited countries shall not exceed 24 persons.

Language

The course will be conducted in English mainly.

Implementing Organization

The course will be conducted by the National Institute for Emergency Medicine (NIEM).

Qualifications for Applicants

- (1) be nominated by their governments in accordance with the procedure indicated in the Application Procedures;
- (2) be physicians, nurses or paramedics working in the national, regional or provincial level;
- (3) Have at least 3 years of work experience, preferably all working for same administrative area.
- (4) have completed at least Bachelor degree or equivalent academic background in Emergency Medicine or other related fields;
- (5) be in good health, both physically and mentally, in order to complete the Course;
- (6) be proficient in spoken English;
- (7) be under 55 years of age;
- (8) not to be serving in the military.

Application Procedure

1) The Applicant or the Government applying for the Course on behalf of applicant(s) shall forward the application form of each applicant not later than **15th August 2024**, and the details are indicated in the following:

Certificate

Participants who successfully complete the training with at least 80 percent attendance will be awarded a certificate by TICA, JICA and NIEM. NIEM will prepare the certificates for participants.

Allowances and Expenses

The following allowances and expenses will be covered by JICA and TICA:

1) Economy class round-trip air ticket between the nearest international airport of the participants' countries and Bangkok will be issued by TICA to the approved candidates. The approved candidates need to send a photocopy of their passport, specifically, the page which shows the correct names, to facilitate the arrangement of electronic air tickets. The electronic air ticket will be sent to the approved candidates.

2) Living allowance according to the rules and regulations of the Government of Thailand will be paid to the participants during their stay in Thailand. This living allowance will cover lunch, dinner and other personal daily expenses. However, each participant is requested to prepare some local money for their expenses prior to the allowance payment.

3) In accordance with relevant regulations, free minor medical treatment will be provided for participants who become ill during their stay in Thailand.

Accommodation and Meals

The accommodation of the participants will be available at the Hotel (TBC). Participants will have single room in principle. A longer stay cannot be permitted in the accommodation. Participants need to make arrangements themselves for their meals including breakfast with the provided allowance. During short breaks, snacks will be provided by the implementing organization.

Other Information: International Traveling

1) Participants are required to arrive in Thailand on the date designated by TICA and NIEM after the confirmation and acceptance of participation. The confirmed air tickets will be sent to the participants in advance.

2) Participants are responsible for other expenses incurred during travel between the participants' home countries and Thailand, such as local transportation, passport fee, or airport tax.

3) Prior to their arrival in Thailand, and if deemed necessary, all participants need to obtain the Non-Immigrant VISA (F) from the Royal Thai Embassy/Royal Thai Consulate-General in their respective countries or countries nearby.

4) Upon arrival at Bangkok International Airport, participants are asked to look for TICA sign at the AOT Limousine customer relation counters and proceed to it. Participants are required to show the Instruction of Fellowship Award at the counter so that arrangements for airport transfer to the reserved hotel will be made. Participants do not have to pay for the AOT limousine service charge since the cost will be paid directly to AOT by TICA. Participants are recommended not to take a public taxi to the hotel by themselves as the taxi fees cannot be refundable from TICA

5) Participants shall not bring any members of their families with them during the training.

6) The participants are encouraged to bring their own medicine.

Regional Training for Pre-Hospital Emergency Care in CLMV

Background

The Regional Training for Pre-Hospital Emergency Care in CLMV¹ is a series of training courses developed by the National Institute for Emergency Medicine (NIEM), Thailand and supported by the Thailand International Cooperation Agency (TICA) together with Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) to strengthen the emergency medical service (EMS) system in CLMV countries through the ability to have professionally trained personnel. The training program consists of three training courses trained in consequential order using the concept in which the key personnel who can make decisions on EMS development shall be approached to better equipped them with necessary body of knowledge to develop fundamental elements of EMS system as a core center of developing agenda, followed by creating instructors aiming at increasing the number of EMS workforce exponentially, and finally enhancing workforce's capacities towards comprehensive framework of emergency medicine theoretically and practically.

Outputs

- (1) Medical Direction Model/Plan of each CLMV countries are developed.
- (2) The emergency medical technician instructors in CLMV countries are developed.
- (3) The capacity of emergency medical technicians in CLMV countries is strengthened.

Duration

The Course will be held for three (3) years

Invited Countries

The governments of the following countries will be invited to nominate applicant(s) to attend the Course: Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar and Vietnam.

Courses

Year 1: EMS Medical Director Training Course

Year 2: Emergency Medical Service Leadership and Management Training Course

Year 3: Emergency Medical Technician Instructors Course

In each year, the number of participants from the invited countries will be different, but shall not exceed twenty-four (24).
