

Protection of the Operations of the International Atomic Energy Agency in Thailand Act

Given on the 21st Day of March B.E. 2505 (1962);

Being the 17th Year of the Present Reign.

Whereas it is expedient to have a law on the Protection of the Operations of the International Atomic Energy Agency in Thailand;

His Majesty the King, by and with the advice and consent of the Constitutional Drafting Council, as the National Legislative Assembly, is graciously pleased to enact this Act as follows:

Section 1. This Act is called the "Protection of the Operations of the International Atomic Energy Agency in Thailand B.E. 2505 (1962)";

Section 2. This Act shall come into force from the day following the date of its publication in the Government Gazette;

Section 3. To protect of the operations in Thailand of the International Atomic Energy Agency, to fulfill the achievement of its objectives:

(1) The International Atomic Energy Agency shall be recognized as a juristic person, and be deemed to have domicile in Thailand;

(2) The International Atomic Energy Agency, its premises, assets, property and documents, and the representatives of Members and staff of the International Atomic Energy Agency, as well as experts performing duties for the International Atomic Energy Agency, during their performance of duties in Thailand or the entry into Thailand to perform their duties or performing their duties in connection with the International Atomic Energy Agency, shall be accorded privileges and

Energy Agency, adopted by the Board of Governors of the International Atomic Energy Agency on 1st July B.E. 2502 (1959), only to the extent that the Government has agreed to comply, or the agreement done or to be done between the Government and the International Atomic Energy Agency;

Section 4. The Minister of Foreign Affairs shall have charge and control of this Act.

N.B. - This Act is enacted because Thailand has become a member of the International Atomic Energy Agency and has the obligation to provide privileges and immunities in Thailand, in accordance with the Agreement on Privileges and Immunities of the International Atomic Energy Agency, adopted by the Board of Governors of the International Atomic Energy Agency on 1st July B.E. 2502 (1959). Therefore it is expedient to enact a law to implement section 38 of the Agreement.
