Updated entry requirements and quarantine measures (effective from 1 May 2022)

**Travellers who do not have a valid Thai visa, re-entry permit, or those who are not eligible to enter Thailand under the Visa Exemption Scheme or Visa on Arrival (VOA), must apply for a visa. Please visit https://bucharest.thaiembassy.org/en/content/updated-general-tourist-visa-requirements?cate=5d7e89db15e39c1d900056f2 for general requirements for tourist visa. For other types of visa, please send an email to visa.BUH@mfa.go.th for further instructions.

**All travellers must register for Thailand Pass via https://tp.consular.go.th/ at the earliest opportunity, at least 7 working days in advance before their departure date. The registration requires approval by Thai health officers, who may reject registration with incomplete/incorrect documents. Please refer to Thailand Pass FAQs at https://consular.mfa.go.th/th/content/thailand-pass-faqs-2?cate=5ddbe42115e39c4768007e1d before proceeding with your registration.

In case your registration takes longer than 7 working days, please send an email to testgo@consular.go.th or thailandpass.hkt@gmail.com (for those travelling to Phuket, Krabi, or Phang-Nga) for enquiries about your registration status. To help us identify your issues quickly, please include the following information: full name / passport number/ date of arrival right at the beginning of your email.

- 1. Entry requirements (effective from 1 May 2022):
 - Exemption from quarantine:
 - (1) Fully vaccinated travellers:
 - Must be fully vaccinated at least 14 days before departure. The vaccination day is considered Day 0.
 - Must present certificate of vaccination according to the Thai Ministry of Public Health's regulations.
 - Must have health insurance with minimum coverage of 10,000 USD for medical treatments in Thailand (except for Thai nationals).
 - (2) Unvaccinated / Not fully vaccinated travellers:
 - Must present medical certificate with a laboratory result indicating that COVID-19 is not detected, using RT-PCR method, which has been certified or issued no more than 72 hours before departure. The certificate has to be uploaded in the Thailand Pass registration system. Children under 6 years old are exempt from RT-PCR test.
 - Must have health insurance with minimum coverage of 10,000 USD (except for Thai nationals).

Alternative Quarantine:

- Unvaccinated / Not fully vaccinated travellers:
 - Must undergo 5-day quarantine at an AQ facility.
 - Hotel reservation must be inclusive of 1 RT-PCR test, airport pick-up, and 3 meals per day (full board). They will undergo an RT-PCR test on Day 4 or Day 5.

 - Must have health insurance with minimum coverage of 10,000 USD for medical treatments in Thailand (except for Thai nationals).

2. Conditions for children:

- Unvaccinated children under 18 years old who travel with their parent(s) or guardian(s) may enter Thailand under the same conditions as their parent(s) or guardian(s).
- Unvaccinated children from 18 years old are eligible to be exempt from quarantine (point 1 (2) above) or stay in AQ for no less than 5 nights.
- Children from 5 17 years old can enter Thailand without parent(s) or guardian(s) if they
 have received at least one dose of the accepted vaccines no less than 14 days before
 departure and they are considered fully vaccinated.
- 3. Foreign nationals are required to present health insurance in English with a minimum coverage of 10,000 USD. Health insurance in Romanian/Bulgarian showing coverage in RON/BGN is not accepted.

4. Accommodation:

- For travellers who choose to stay in AQ hotels, a letter of confirmation must be in English
 and specify names of guests, details of the package which includes one RT-PCR test and
 prepayment confirmation.
- Accommodation booking uploaded in the Thailand Pass system will be verified by the Thai officials, therefore, it is highly recommended to contact your hotel and receive a direct booking confirmation to avoid being rejected.
- 5. List of Vaccines approved by the Thai FDA and/or the WHO (as of 31 March 2022):
 - CoronaVac (Sinovac Biotech Ltd.) (2 doses, 2 weeks apart)
 - AstraZeneca / Covishield / Vaxzevria (2 doses, 4 weeks apart)
 - Pfizer-BioNTech / Comirnaty / Tozinameran (INN) (2 doses, 3 weeks apart)
 - Moderna (2 doses, 4 weeks apart)
 - Janssen / Ad26.COV2.5 (Johnson & Johnson Services Inc.) (1 dose)
 - Sinopharm / COVILO (Sinopharm Co., Ltd.) (2 doses, 3 weeks apart)

- Sputnik V (Gamaleya Research Institute of Epidemiology and Microbiology) (2 doses, 3 weeks apart)
- Covaxin (2 doses, 4 weeks apart)
- Medigen (2 doses, 4 weeks apart)
- Novavax / Nuvavoxid (2 doses, 3 weeks apart)
- Turkovac / ERUCOV-VAC (2 doses, 4 weeks apart)

6. Remarks:

Travellers who have recovered from infection are considered fully vaccinated if they have received one dose of the accepted vaccines after infection no less than 14 days before departure and they can provide a recovery certificate or a medical certificate confirming their infection. Those who are fully vaccinated but later get infected are still considered fully vaccinated, however, proof of recovery is required.

7. INTERNATIONAL TRANSIT/TRANSFER PASSENGERS AT SUVARNABHUMI OR DON-MUEANG INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT:

- Travellers transitting/transferring at Suvarnabhumi or Don-Mueang International Airport (lay-over time not exceeding 24 hours / check-through luggage only / cannot leave transit area / final destination is outside of Thailand) do not need to register for Thailand Pass, but are required to have the following documents:
 - Medical Certificate with a laboratory result indicating that COVID-19 is not detected, using RT-PCR method, which has been certified or issued no more than 72 hours before departure, OR certificate of vaccination showing that the last dose was administered no less than 14 days before the date of departure.
 - Travel health insurance covering health care and treatment expenses for COVID-19 disease, or any other guarantee throughout their stay in the Kingdom, with a coverage of no less than 10,000 USD. This requirement (insurance) does not apply to Thai travellers.
