This Months Regional Highlight

Ayutthaya

Phra Nakhon Si Ayutthaya (or Ayutthaya) is one of the central provinces (changwat) of Thailand. Neighboring provinces are (from north clockwise) Ang Thong, Lop Buri, Saraburi, Pathum Thani, Nonthaburi, Nakhon Pathom and Suphan Buri. The name Ayutthaya derives from the Ayodhya of the Ramayana epic.

Getting There:

Ayutthaya is 76 kilometres north of Bangkok. There were three palaces in Ayutthaya: Grand Palace, Chantharakasem Palace or the Front Palace, and Wang Lang or the Rear Palace. In addition, there were many other palaces and buildings for royal visits located outside the city area of Phra Nakhon Si Ayutthaya, such as Bang Pa-In Palace at Amphoe Bang Pa-in and Nakhon Luang Building at Amphoe Nakhon Luang.



Air: There is no airport in Ayutthaya province.

<u>River:</u> Located on the Chao Phraya River, Siam's former kings all the way up to King Rama V, once used river as their main mode of transportation. There are still boats running from Bangkok to Ayutthaya but they are mainly for the trade of local agricultural products. The occasional tourist boat can also be seen.

Roads: Due to its strategic central positioning, there are numerous highways which run through Ayutthaya. Eight in total, the province has the most highways passing through in the whole of Thailand.

<u>Rail:</u> Ayutthaya lies on both the main north and northern-eastern routes and trains are available to either direction.

<u>Bus:</u> Air-conditioned buses ply regularly to and from Bangkok. In Bangkok the buses leave from the Northern Bus Terminal (Morchid). From the Ayutthaya Bus Terminal there are non air-conditioned buses to other districts and neighbouring provinces.

<u>Passenger Van:</u> Passengers vans, running frequently from Bangkok, depart from Victory Monument in Bangkok. Doing the journey in just an hour, they are the quickest mode of public transport between the two cities.



<u>Songthaew</u> (public passenger pick-up vehicles): Songthaews are the most popular form of public transport in the provincial city and rural areas.

Motorbike-taxi: There is plenty of motor-bike service in the town especially around the market and Bus Terminal areas.













Where to Go

<u>Ayutthaya Tourism Centre:</u> The centre is established by the Fine Arts Department and developed to be a tourist information centre by the Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) with high reliefs of 6 great kings and queens from the Ayutthaya Kingdom on the facade of the building remain in their original positions. The center is home to TAT information center, an exhibition on Phra Nakhon Si Ayutthaya's tourism and a contemporary art gallery.

Ayutthaya Historical Study Centre: is a national research institute devoted to the study of Ayutthaya, especially during the period when Ayutthaya was the capital of Siam. The Centre is responsible for the museum of the history of Ayutthaya, which exhibits reconstructions from the past. The Centre also supports an information service and a library containing historical materials about Ayutthaya.

Chao Sam Phraya National Museum: The construction of this museum was funded by the proceeds from the sale of votive tablets discovered in the underground crypts of the principal Prang tower of Wat Ratchaburana. Since the temple was built by King Borommarachathirat II (Chao Sam Phraya), the museum was named after him. The opening ceremony of this museum was held in 1961 and was presided over by Their Majesties the King and the Queen. It was the first museum in the country to present a new form of exhibition, displaying artefacts unearthed from the archaeological excavations as well as restoration of ancient monuments.

<u>Wat Phra Si Sanphet:</u> This important and most impressive monastery is located in the Grand Palace compound like Wat Phra Si Rattanasatsadaram (Wat Phra Kaeo) of Bangkok. Used as a residential palace, it became a monastery in the reign of King Ramathibodi I. When King Borom Trai Lokanat commanded new living quarters built, this residential palace was given to be a temple area, thus originating Wat Phra Si Sanphet: The royal chapel does not have any monks and novice inhabitants.

<u>Grand Palace</u>: Currently called "Ancient Palace". The residential palace of every king was located close to the city wall of Ayutthaya. Important buildings inside the Grand Palace compound are Wihan Somdet Hall, Sanphet Prasat Hall, Suriyat Amarin Hall, Chakkrawat Phaichayon Hall, Trimuk Hall and Banyong Rattanat Hall

<u>Wat Chaiwatthanaram:</u> is another monastery; King Prasat Thong commanded it built. The great beauty has been reflected from the main stupa and its satellite stupas along the gallery, an architecture influenced by Khmer.

<u>Wat Yai Chaimongkhon or Wat Chao Phraya Thai:</u> This monastery constructed in the reign of King U-Thong. King Naresuan the Great commanded that the pagoda be built to celebrate the victory of his single-handed combat on the elephant back. He also intended a huge construction to match the large pagoda of Wat Phukhao Thong, and named it "Phra Chedi Chaiyamongkhon".

<u>Bang Sai Arts and Crafts Centre:</u> Farmers from Ayutthaya as well as from other provinces undergo training in folk arts and crafts here. At this centre, visitors have a glimpse of how farmers in the four regions live and work and how their products of arts and crafts are produced.

Bang Pa-In Palace: Originally, Bang Pa-In was a riverine island. When King Prasat Thong became the Ayutthaya king (1630-1655), he had the Chumphon Nikayaram Temple built on his family estate. The palace surrounded by a lake 400 metres long and 40 metres wide. Bang Pa-In was used as a country residence by every Ayutthaya monarch after King Prasat Thong.

<u>Elephant Kraal Pavilion:</u> Located 4 km from Ayutthaya on Highway No. 309, Elephant Kraal Pavilion was the royal seat used to enjoy the spectacle of the elephants. The structure is a big cage surrounded with logs. The Kraal is also surrounded by an earthen wall with bricks raised up to the pillar top. The pavilion is set behind the Kraal and in front of the front fencing line. The Kraal Pavilion was last renovated in 1957.













Activities

Homestay:

Many visitors to Ayutthaya experience traditional Thai lifestyle, Thai-style dwellings, canal-side scenery and the peaceful atmosphere by way of 'homestay'. Two popular places for this kind of accommodation is at Khlong Rang Chorakhe which is home to a 400-year-old image of Luangpho To image at Wat Rang Chorakhe and Bang Sai which is a community on the Noi River in Amphoe Bang Sai.

Elephant Back Activities

This activity is found at Ayutthaya Elephant Camp. Elephantstay in Ayutthaya is a fantastic way for you to get hands on experience and make a real difference to the lives of our old elephants. Stay in the most exciting, innovative, working elephant village in Asia, dedicated to conserving elephants, only one hour from Bangkok.

Boat Trips

Boat trips long the Chao Phraya River is a popular activity to enjoy the scenery and traditional life-styles. At Nawa Nakhorn there are nicely decorated old-fashioned boats.

Airport trains start 23rd August 2010

The State Railway of Thailand confirms the Airport Link train will begin commercial services on 23 August.

Minister of transport, Sopon Zarum, told the National News Bureau, yesterday, that the airport train running between downtown Bangkok to Suvarnabhumi Airport would be officially opened to the public by the new deadline.

There are two distinct services. The city-line train, catering to commuters and airport workers, will stop at all stations between Phya Thai and Suvarnabhumi Airport, while the non-stop Airport Express, serving passengers, departs from the main station at Makkasan taking just 15 minutes to reach the airport.

The launch has been postponed several times due to technical complications. At present, the luggage check-in system is not yet ready as it is still waiting verification from the independent consulting engineers.

The non-stop express line will have a fare of Bt100 per person, down from Bt150.

The Airport Link has been operating free trials since last month with around 7,870 passengers a day. The trail runs operate only on weekdays, 0700 to 1000 and 1600 to 1900. Some of the stations will not be ready until early July.













Samphran Elephant Ground & Zoo


