Regulations on Entry to Thailand by Air after 1 July 2022

As the COVID-19 situation in Thailand has improved accordingly and the Thai government has eased regulations and measures during the transition to **the post-pandemic period**, Thailand's Centre for COVID-19 Situation Administration (CCSA) issued Regulation No. 13/2565 on 23 June 2022 to revise entry regulations for travellers to Thailand after 1 July 2022 as follows:

- 1. All Thai and foreign travellers are not required to register for Thailand Pass before entering Thailand (previously, only Thai nationals were not required to register for Thailand Pass)
- 2. Foreign travellers are not required to have health insurance in Thailand (previously, they were required to have a minimum coverage of 10,000 USD for medical expenses in Thailand)
- 3. Upon arriving in Thailand, health control authorities will check the following documents:
 - 3.1 Certificate of Vaccination or
- 3.2 For unvaccinated or not fully vaccinated travellers, negative RT-PCR **or** professional ATK test result (**not self-ATK test**) within 72 hours of travel.
 - 4. Documentations for travellers who are minors:
- 4.1 Minors aged <u>below 18</u> and travelling <u>with fully vaccinated</u> parents can enter Thailand under the same scheme as their parents.
- 4.2 Minors aged <u>below 18</u> and travelling <u>with unvaccinated or not fully vaccinated parents</u> are to present a negative RT-PCR <u>or</u> professional ATK test result within 72 hours of travel. <u>Minor aged below 6 are exempted from presenting the test result</u>.

4.3 <u>Minors aged between 5 – 17 who travel alone</u> are required to present a certificate of vaccination with at least 1 dose of vaccination <u>or</u> a negative RT-PCR or professional ATK test result within 72 hours of travel

Please be noted that the airlines will check all the documentation before check-in. Upon arrival in Thailand, health control authorities might randomly check travellers' documentation. If the travellers fail to present valid required documents, they might be asked to take a Covid-19 test **at their own expenses**.
