The Director General of the International Organization for Migration presents his compliments to the Permanent Representatives and other representatives of the Member States of the International Organization for Migration and has the honour to extend an invitation to participate in the **113th Session of the Council**, which will take place **from 29 November to 2 December 2022**, starting at 10 a.m., at the Centre International de Conférences Genève (CICG).

Following the success of the high-level segment during the 112th Session of the Council, and given the strength of engagement shown by Member States, the Administration has decided to continue the good practice by organizing another **high-level segment** during the forthcoming Council session, focusing on the intersection between climate change, food security, migration and displacement. The high-level segment will be held on **Tuesday, 29 November, from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m. in hybrid format**. Further information is included in the information note for participants. It would be appreciated if this invitation could also be shared with relevant departments in capitals.

In order for delegates to participate in the work of the Council, the Meetings Secretariat must receive, in advance, a **note verbale or letter from the Permanent Mission accrediting its representatives by name and title**. While no specific format is prescribed, and notification from capitals is not required, the aforementioned communication must be in writing and signed, and sent to the Meetings Secretariat by email to iomcr@iom.int, at the latest by **Tuesday, 22 November 2022**.

All accredited delegates must also complete the **online registration form** (available [here](#)), at the latest by Tuesday, 22 November 2022.

Before entering the conference room, all representatives will be required to confirm their presence upon arrival at the IOM desk (open half an hour before the start of the meeting) at the entrance to the conference room. Participants in possession of a United Nations accreditation badge are requested to bring their badge and to wear it visibly.

The proceedings can be accessed and followed online through Zoom during the meeting. However, in the event of a vote, only those attending in person will be able to vote. Further details on the logistical aspects of the event will be shared in the coming weeks.

Simultaneous interpretation will be provided in English, French and Spanish. All documents relating to the various items on the agenda will be available on the IOM website at: 113th Session of the IOM Council.
