Policy Statement of the Council of Ministers Delivered by Prime Minister Srettha Thavisin to the National Assembly Monday, 11 September B.E. 2566 (2023)

Honourable President of the National Assembly,

Pursuant to the Royal Command of 22 August B.E. 2566 (2023) appointing me as Prime Minister and the Royal Command of 1 September B.E. 2566 (2023) appointing the Ministers, the Council of Ministers has now formulated the policy for the administration of state affairs, which is in adherence to a democratic regime of government with the King as Head of State. The policy is also in accordance with Chapter V: Duties of the State and Chapter VI: Directive Principles of State Policies of the Constitution of the Kingdom of Thailand B.E. 2560 (2017) as well as the National Strategy B.E. 2561-2580 (2018-2037). The Council of Ministers therefore wishes to present its Policy Statement to the National Assembly in order to inform the latter of the objectives, strategies and policies of this Government, which aim to build unity and harmony in Thai society, leading to cooperation and progress on economic, social, and political development and governance of the nation for the greatest benefit of all the Thai people.

Honourable President of the National Assembly,

Today, Thailand is facing critical challenges economically, socially and politically. These challenges have been exacerbated by the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, which, in turn, has resulted in an economic crisis with far-reaching impact. Even now, the Thai economy has yet to make a full recovery and remedy its losses in a tangible manner. At the same time, political and social problems have persisted and become deeply rooted, without being effectively and systematically addressed.

Over 30.9% of Thailand's GDP is generated by a limited cluster of goods in the industrial sector. The country's trade balance has suffered a deficit for three consecutive quarters. The trend further suggests that its exports are likely to continue to contract due to both internal factors, such as the replacement of obsolete technologies with more advanced ones and vulnerability to technological disruptions, as well as external factors, such as competition in the region and economic outlook of its trading partners around the world.

Technological disruptions pose a challenge to Thailand's competitiveness and have become a defining factor in the economic landscape. In this regard, the Government must formulate a policy that helps to identify and develop the strengths of the Thai economy and invest in the necessary infrastructure in order to generate benefits for all the citizens.

The Thai economy is also affected by the transformation of the geopolitical landscape. The global political, economic, and social contexts have changed. The era of economic globalisation is ending and shifting into a polarised global economy. This poses as new challenges to trade liberalisation, tourism, and investments which Thailand has benefitted from in the past.

The international economic and security conflicts among the world's major powers will continue to intensify, creating a challenging global context in which Thailand has to navigate by carefully and appropriately formulating its role and positioning itself in order to safeguard its interests, to promote peace, and to ensure security for all its people.

Thailand is also facing a high level of household debt, amounting to over 90% of its GDP. This represents the vulnerability of its people to potential economic shocks. In addition, its public debt-to-GDP ratio is higher than 61% and likely to remain high with possibility to become a fiscal limitation or a constraint to the administration of state affairs in the future. This is particularly concerning given that the country's past average economic growth rates have been lower than their true potential. This demonstrates that Thailand's capacity to generate income is still lower than its expenses, resulting in chronic debt problems and widening inequalities, with over 14 million people who earn less than national average income awaiting assistance from the Government.

The agricultural sector represents another side of the Thai economy. While more than 10 million Thais, or about one third of the country's labour force, are employed in this sector, this sector contributes only 7% to the national GDP. This reflects the reality that agricultural practices in Thailand still rely on the mercy of mother nature, with low yield and constantly rising costs. This places a debt burden at an average of more than 300,000 baht per household on Thai farmers.

Climate change and emerging diseases not only have a direct impact on humanity as a whole, but also indirectly result in new rules and regulations affecting the contours of global trade and tourism. The impact of extreme weather, which further engenders El Nino, also adversely affects a large number of Thai farmers, making it imperative for the Government to work on enhancing the country's preparedness against these events and reducing the severity of their impact on the economy and the lives of the people.

Turning to the social sphere, Thailand has become an aged society with the elderly accounting for more than 20% of its population. This will impact the economic capacity of the country as a result of a smaller workforce. The older population will also likely require more support from the Government.

The increasing ratio of older population places additional fiscal pressure on the Government, including in terms of the welfare and healthcare budget. At the same time, building new human resources to replace the retired workforce has been challenging due to a continuously declining birth rate.

Other than a quantitative challenge, the educational sector in the country also faces a qualitative challenge, as it is unable to produce adequate human resources needed to meet the demands of the new economy. New graduates are not able to find jobs that match their skills or they have to resort to earning an income in an occupation that is below their level of competence.

On the political front, Thailand has entered a transitional phase in legal, political and governance, whereby differences of views or ideas, as well as an intolerance of diversity of identities and cultures have placed society at a disconcerting juncture.

Outdated laws that do not keep up with the current state of affairs have become tools for corruption, bribery, crimes, fraud, gambling and illicit drugs, all of which are worsening, and adding to the people's despair in the country's political system and civil service.

Honourable President of the National Assembly,

These aforementioned challenges are some of the factors leading to poverty, inequality and hardships in Thai society. They undermine the country's readiness and ability to grow and realise its full potential, while at the same time stir up a crisis of faith among the people. For this reason, these are the most immediate issues that this Government will address, in order to cultivate the country's readiness and lay a foundation for a better future for all Thai people in the present and for the future.

Honourable President of the National Assembly,

This Government has a policy to protect and preserve the institution of the Monarchy, nurture the correct understanding and disseminate information on a regular basis about the work and endeavours of the institution of the Monarchy as well as the Royal Thai volunteers, which are based on Royal initiatives. The Government will also support religious institutions as a means to foster morality and ethics for society and in people's daily lives.

To address pressing issues, build readiness and lay a foundation for the future for every Thai person, the Government has formulated policy frameworks that will govern the administration of state affairs and national development, based on the level of urgency, as follows:

In the short-term framework, the Government needs to stimulate spending and re-ignite the economic engine of growth, while addressing immediate issues faced by the people in an expeditious manner.

In the medium and long-term framework, the Government will enhance capacities for the people by creating income, reducing expenses, generating opportunities, reducing inequalities and enhancing the quality of life for everyone.

Honourable President of the National Assembly,

With the current economic situation, Thailand can be compared to a patient who has been more disproportionately affected during the COVID-19 pandemic than its neighbouring countries. This has resulted in several sectors that serve as our economic engine of growth, such as the tourism sector as well as general spending to recover so slowly as to the point that the economy is at risk of falling into a recession. For this reason, there is a need to stimulate the economy and spending, and restore confidence in order to attract investments and revive the engine of growth once again.

The policy to provide 10,000 baht through a digital wallet will act as a trigger to revitalise the economy. The policy will inject purchasing power throughout the entire economy, reaching and circulating in every corner and at every level. This will result in stimulated spending, rising quality of life, creation of opportunities for people and enterprises to expand investments and businesses, and rising production of goods; leading to employment and job creation as well as the circulation and multiplication of economic activities. The Government will also benefit from tax revenue.

Most importantly, the implementation of this policy will lay the foundation for the country's digital economy, prepare the country for a modern economy, create new opportunities for the people, open the door to new sources of capital for the business sector, and improve the efficiency and transparency of payment systems of the economy and the Government.

Honourable President of the National Assembly,

The aforementioned economic stimulus is the starting point for economic recovery. The Government also has many other policies that can be implemented quickly, in order to address the issues expeditiously and assist the people, as follows:

The first policy is to address the debt issue in the agricultural sector, business sector, and the general public. The Government will alleviate the debt burden on farmers by suspending their debt servicing based on appropriate conditions and qualifications. The government will implement measures to support the general public regarding the debt burden and financial cost concerns that cover small and medium enterprises (SMEs) affected by COVID-19, in order to provide opportunity to recover and resume their businesses once again. In addition, the Government will also implement measures to solve the debt problem for other groups, but this will be based firmly on the thinking that it must not violate fiscal discipline nor cause moral hazard for debtors.

The next urgent policy is to reduce the burden of energy costs for the people, which is a prerequisite for the people's daily lives and the economy. The Government will support the immediate management and adjustment, at the appropriate levels, of energy prices, including electricity, liquefied petroleum gas and gasoline.

In addition, the Government will adjust the national energy consumption structure by planning the demand and supporting the supply of the appropriate sources of energy, promoting the production and use of clean and renewable energy in accordance with an approach that advances sustainable economic and environmental development, accelerating negotiations with neighbouring countries on development of energy resources located within overlapping claims areas, exploring additional energy sources, and supporting the search for new energy sources under market mechanisms to ensure the energy security required for the country to move forward.

The Government's third policy will promote income generation from the tourism industry because tourism will be the first key to stimulate the economy in the short-term and create employment opportunities for a large number of people. We aim to open our doors to tourists by facilitating and improving the visa application process, waiving visa fees for tourists from target countries, issuing Fast Track VISA for international trade exhibition (MICE) participants. In order to stimulate tourist spending at the end of the year, the Government will collaborate with businesses from all sectors to host trade exhibitions and international fairs to showcase Thailand as another important regional exhibition venue.

At the same time, the Government will pursue the improvement and management of every step of service involved as a gateway into Thailand. This includes improving land, water and air transportation systems. The Government will improve airports, effectively manage the flights at every airport across the country, increase the number of flights to bring in more tourists to Thailand, address corruption and eliminate the exploitation of tourists. Ensuring tourist safety will build confidence and leave a lasting positive impression of Thailand in the long term.

The last urgent policy is to resolve the differences of opinion regarding the Constitution of the Kingdom of Thailand, B.E. 2560 (2017) so that the Thai people can enjoy a more democratic constitution that adheres to the democratic regime of government with the King as Head of State, without modifying the chapter relating to the Monarchy in the Constitution. The Government will discuss guidelines for a referendum that give emphasis to the participation of all sectors of the public in designing rules and regulations that are democratic, modern, and mutually accepted, including discussing guidelines for formulating a constitution in the National Assembly, to ensure that the country can move forward firmly and securely.

The Government will establish its legitimacy in the administration of state affairs under a democratic regime of government with the King as Head of State by restoring the rule of law which is strong, efficient, transparent, and internationally accepted. Upholding the rule of law credibly is an investment in the country's critical ideological and social infrastructure. It is also the most effective investment in national development with the least national budget expenditure committed.

Honourable President of the National Assembly,

Apart from implementing the urgent policies to solve the aforementioned specific problems, the Government has also adopted policies that will have a medium- and long-term impact and create better lives for the Thai people concurrently in multiple aspects, including generating income, creating opportunities, improving the quality of life and restoring the dignity of being Thai, through the implementation of the following policies:

The Government has an approach to generate income by utilising proactive economic diplomacy to open up doors to new markets for Thai products and services, such as the European Union, countries in the Middle East, India, Africa, and South America, as well as maintaining importance placed on existing markets, including in neighbouring countries. This will be pursued through meetings with leaders of different countries in order to invite them to trade goods and services, which will increase opportunities for products and services created with the skills of the Thai people. The Government will also accelerate Free Trade Area (FTA) negotiations as well as negotiate visa-free arrangements for Thai passport holders to allow Thais to travel to more countries. Additionally, the Government will improve the investment project approval process through the Office of the Board of Investment of Thailand and the Eastern Economic Corridor Office of Thailand in order to attract foreign investments that will increase production capacity, add value and lay a firm foundation for the economy in the long run.

The Government will promote new economic developments and industries, such as the development of the digital economy, high-technology industry, green industry and national security industry, including domestic research and development of technology and innovation to support a new growth engine for the economy and to improve national competitiveness. This includes further development of special economic zones and economic corridors in all four regions to become more efficient, as well as the development of areas and cities according to city plans that are consistent with the needs of the people so that economic prosperity and economic activities spread to all regions.

To promote new economic developments and industries in the country, the Government will establish a Matching Fund, a joint investment between the Government and the private sector, to develop start-ups with potential to flourish and become competitive at the global level as well as strengthen new businesses. The Government will also support the capital market to ensure the confidence of both domestic and foreign investors.

At the same time, the Government will further develop legal economic trade along the border to generate income and employment opportunities for the people as well as to support stability and create mutual benefit for all countries. Thailand will play a leading role in promoting world peace and common global benefits, and manage geopolitical situations appropriately.

The Government will invest in the country's transportation infrastructure, including roads, waterways, railways and air transportation, and connect the means of transportation of people, goods, and services, with prices and service levels that are fair and commensurate with the cost of living, in order to promote ease of travel for the people and open up doors for trade and opportunities for Thailand. It will also generate benefits from the public assets to meet the global demand for new goods and services.

As for those in the agricultural sector, the Government will generate income in this sector by implementing the principles of **market-led**, **innovation-driven and income-growth** by jointly supporting the efficiency and productivity of the agricultural sector. There will be an integration of knowledge on effective water management to meet the demand for water in each region, and the utilisation of agricultural plots with precision farming, research and development of species and varieties, in order to increase productivity and the value of crop yield, as well as finding markets for agricultural products to be sold at reasonable prices, encouraging changes in agricultural practices to suit the natural environment and the economy, and increasing the value of agricultural products by means of processing.

Furthermore, the Government will revive the fishing industry as an important source of income for the people once again by amending and enforcing the law appropriately, towards the sustainable management of marine resources for the country.

The comprehensive management of the agricultural sector in all aspects, including soil, water, plant varieties, animal breeds, price mechanisms, funding sources, innovation and land ownership of crop farmers, livestock farmers and fishermen groups, aims at increasing the income of farmers throughout the country significantly within a period of four years.

Income generation through these aforementioned policies will be important factors in building a dignified life for the Thai people, with fair salaries and minimum wage, consistent and sufficient with sustenance, which will grow alongside the country's economic expansion, and in enabling workers to access an appropriate welfare system.

Honourable President of the National Assembly,

In addition to an increased income which is sufficient to sustain a living, the Government intends to create and expand opportunities for the people through the implementation of the following policies:

The first policy aims to enable the people to leverage their assets to create career opportunities, generate income and ensure stability in life. The Government intends to do so by expediting the process of granting land rights to the people so that they can enjoy stability in life, and by considering utilising the right documents as official title deeds. This will facilitate access to financial resources, which can then be utilised for land development leading to an improved long-term quality of life.

In addition, the Government will promote practices that will concurrently generate income from land and improve the environment, by specifying the proportion of perennial trees planted that are suited to the type and characteristics of the area, as well as by encouraging landowners and nearby communities to benefit from enhancements made to the ecosystem, and the fair and internationally recognised sale of carbon credits.

As for the next policy, there will be a shift in the role of the state from being a strict regulator overburdened with rules and regulations to one of a facilitator that removes constraints and limitations on the people, and creates opportunities for the people to generate income and prosper. This will involve actions such as repealing and amending unnecessary laws, including the relaxation of regulations concerning local alcohol production, among other measures.

The Government will employ a decentralised administrative structure (CEO Governor) to create efficiency in managing each province and local government. This approach is designed to address the needs that are unique to the diverse communities in each area. Specifically, the public will participate in setting objectives and performance metrics in order to create opportunities and the utmost benefits for the people. The government will address corruption and related misconduct resolutely, through the use of modern technology in improving efficient service delivery, boosting transparency, eliminating gaps and opportunities for corruption, reducing expenditures and transforming the public sector into a digital government, thereby bringing convenience to the people.

In addition, the Government will support public participation in resource allocation, including budget decisions and the selection of executive-level representatives responsible for local development in their region which will facilitate the distribution of resources and the decentralisation of administrative authority to the local communities.

Another policy is further opening up the recruitment of foreign workers, professionals and experts who contribute to economic and social benefits, in order to meet the demands for human resources and labour across various sectors, including manufacturing, services and technology development. Foreign workers remain vital in supporting the country's economic growth and competitiveness.

This Government also has a policy to nurture the development of creative talent, or the nation's Soft Power, in order to elevate and cultivate the knowledge, abilities and creativity of the Thai people in generating income and creating value. It includes efforts to conserve, rejuvenate and further enrich the arts and culture while promoting local wisdom aimed at further value creation. In addition, the Government intends to create employment opportunities and generate income by introducing a "One family - One Soft Power" skill, including the systematic promotion and advancement of sports, which other than promoting good health, also nurtures careers in athletics, coaching and sports-related professions, all of which can generate income. This is particularly true for sports that are popular at the international level.

In terms of education, the Government will advance policies aimed at reforming the educational system and creating a society that promotes lifelong learning and cultivates upstanding citizens who are disciplined and take pride in their nation while nurturing the potential of learners based on their aptitudes. The Government encourages reading to pave the way for a prosperous future and income generation and will decentralise education to learners, ensuring that students have comprehensive access to suitable learning materials tailored to their age group. Modern educational technology systems will be employed to develop curriculum and offer guidance aligned with the knowledge and interests of learners. Furthermore, there will be an emphasis on advancing research and development in both the social and applied sciences, as well as frontier research, to push the boundaries of knowledge, technology and innovation. This will be complemented by a commitment to teaching the nation's history and fostering a deep appreciation for its key institutions, in preparation for the economic, social and political transformations of the modern world, underpinned by strong moral and ethical values.

The Government will prioritise the quality of educators countrywide, which includes providing teachers and counselors to guide students academically and to help them access valuable information to make informed decisions about their studies and future career paths. Such guidance extends to caring for

the physical and mental well-being of all students. Furthermore, the Government will encourage income generation opportunities for students, whether they are pursuing academic or vocational paths, allowing them to earn income related to their chosen subjects. This will include internship opportunities during their studies to develop skills and abilities that align with the demands of the job market. Most critically, the Government will undertake measures to address the issue of educational inequality, recognising it as a significant driver of economic disparity within Thai society.

Honourable President of the National Assembly,

In addition to generating income and opportunities, the Government will advance policies to improve the quality of life, enhance safety, create dignity and generate a sense of pride for all Thais.

The foremost component of a good quality of life is being able to maintain security both internally and externally, which is aligned with global circumstances. The Government will support the modernisation and restructuring of the security agencies to enable them to respond effectively to non-traditional threats and security challenges in the 21st century, thereby serving as a critical tool for preserving our independence, fostering stability and ensuring safety countrywide. This includes providing support for addressing and mitigating threats and disasters so as to be able to assist the people in an efficient manner.

In addition, the Government will cooperate with the people to develop the Armed Forces into a pivotal force for realising the nation's potential, by (1) transitioning from a compulsory military service to a voluntary one, (2) improving and transforming the training curriculum for students at the Reserves Training Centre of the Territorial Defense Command into a more creative curriculum, (3) reducing the number of high-ranking commissioned officers, and aligning the Internal Security Operations Command (ISOC) personnel with the country's current and future role and missions, (4) modernising and ensuring transparency in the procurement processes of agencies under the Ministry of Defense, taking into account current and future threat patterns and risks, and (5) utilising surplus military facilities and areas for the benefit of the public, especially for promoting agricultural development, improving infrastructure and utilities, enhancing the ecosystem, and facilitating educational uses to generating income, creating economic opportunities, and fortifying the country's social fabric.

In terms of safety, the Government will collaborate with various sectors of the public to eliminate influential individuals and illicit drugs from Thai society by following the principles of "Transforming drug users into patients,"

which encourages drug users to seek comprehensive and effective treatment. The goal is to increase the number of rehabilitated individuals who can reintegrate into society and contribute to the workforce. Manufacturers and traders involved in the illicit drug trade will face legal repercussions through a rigorous judicial process, including the "confiscation of assets", aimed at disrupting the drug trafficking cycle. The Government is also prepared to engage in diplomatic negotiations with neighbouring countries to control drug smuggling into Thailand, with the ultimate objective of permanently cutting the people out of the cycle of drug trafficking. Furthermore, the Government will pursue policy approaches related to the use of cannabis for medical and health purposes to generate economic value.

The second component for a good quality of life is to ensure a clean environment for all citizens. The Government will prioritise the conservation of the country's natural resources and environment, which are critical factors in national development and impact the well-being of the population. Efforts will be made to promote and expedite the restoration of soil and water quality, maintain ecosystem equilibrium and preserve biodiversity. The Government will address environmental degradation and pollution to restore a healthy environment for the Thai people. Additionally, comprehensive plans will be developed to address and prevent environmental crises in the future. The Government will resolve environmental issues that are a national agenda, particularly the escalating problem of PM_{2.5} air pollution, which continuously worsens and impacts the health of the entire population, by implementing both positive and negative economic incentives in the agricultural sector, leveraging satellite data for monitoring and enforcement, and fostering collaboration with neighbouring countries to address these challenges.

The third component for a good quality of life involves the creation and development of a more effective public healthcare system capable of responding to emergencies and emerging diseases that may arise in the future, including ensuring vaccine availability and security for the country in the long term.

The Government aims to elevate and enhance the quality of the "30-baht policy to treat all diseases" (Universal Health Coverage) and make it even more effective and comprehensive. The public will enjoy greater convenience with basic healthcare services being offered closer to home. Namely doctor's appointments, blood tests and medication will be readily available in all local areas, eliminating the need for people to travel long distances to city hospitals, alleviating congestion and reducing the workload on medical personnel. We will also enhance mechanisms for health promotion and disease prevention, with a particular focus on administering vaccines to safeguard against diseases

such as cervical cancer in children and women. Additionally, the Government will establish health promotion facilities and local nursing homes to provide care for terminally ill patients. Of the utmost importance is that public health services will be accessible through a single ID card, with all data securely stored in a connected database. This means that individuals can access these services anywhere in Thailand. Furthermore, The Government will prioritise the development of public utilities to ensure clean water and sanitation, including by developing the water supply systems in order to provide clean and accessible water for use and consumption to all.

As for the final component underpinning a good quality of life, the Government places a strong emphasis on equality for all Thais from all segments of the population, including vulnerable groups, persons with disabilities, the elderly, and ethnic groups, and will ensure they are respected, live in dignity, with employment, earning an income, and enjoying an improved quality of life, through "State Welfare".

The Government will advance legislation supporting the rights and equality of groups representing gender diversity, including utilising the women's empowerment fund mechanism to offer opportunities to women in local communities to access financial resources in order to establish careers, generate income, and lead secure lives. Additionally, the Government will foster collaboration between the Government and the people, and between individuals with varying beliefs, religions and ideologies, to be able to coexist peacefully under a robust framework underpinning the rule of law, so that such a peace will serve as the foundation for further national development.

Honourable President of the National Assembly,

This Government will be one that drives the economy, politics, society, and the environment with precise and up-to-date information. It is a government that will fully utilise technology and digital systems, radio frequencies and satellite orbital rights for the betterment of our country and its people. The Government will actively engage in the exchange of information and technology with countries worldwide, while at the same time, give importance to countering cross-border threats and bolstering cybersecurity. Furthermore, the Government will provide media literacy and digital skills training to the public, ensuring that Thailand advances rapidly, stays in step with global trends, and remains future-ready in all aspects. The Government will prioritise a collaborative, integrated approach among government agencies to achieve our long-term national development goals.

The multi-faceted policies this Government has announced represents an administration for a better future for our country and people. But at the same time, the Government will not abandon its fundamental duty, which requires it to work together with the people, for instance to foster fairness in the protection and safeguarding of the rights of individuals and consumers, the prevention and elimination of corruption that are open to public participation, the facilitation of the effective access of the people to the justice system, and the cultivation of every sector in order to enhance our country's potential to generate income. The Government will serve as a primary driving force alongside the people, the private sector and government agencies, in driving our country towards a brighter future.

The Government will promote openness and welcome diversity in terms of identity, beliefs, and ideas among both the existing population and those who come for work, travel, or immigrate, and bring with them different cultural traditions and beliefs. The aim is to establish Thailand as a destination for individuals who excel in various fields so that they can contribute significantly to the country's development together, making Thailand a home where everyone feels safe, comfortable, and able to thrive and live together peacefully.

Furthermore, the Government will play an active role on the global stage, prioritising balanced diplomatic relations with other countries based firmly on national interests. This will involve strengthening ties with neighbouring countries, maintaining Thailand's prominent position in the region and sub-region, and fostering collaboration with groups of countries, and international economic and development organisations, in order to enhance confidence and security in Thailand.

The Government remains committed to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, with a strong focus on addressing inequality in Thai society, enhancing well-being for all through measures such as road safety and reducing the rate of preventable diseases and premature deaths, fostering fair competition, and promoting peace and protecting human rights. In addition, the Government will continue with the Carbon Neutrality policy, positioning Thailand as a leader in ASEAN in reducing carbon emissions, thereby opening doors to global trade opportunities. This advantage extends to domestic producers of goods and services, allowing the Government to engage in international trade negotiations under new rules that prioritise efficient use of resources and environmental sustainability. Sustainable development will serve as a pivotal force in driving the country's economy forward across the manufacturing, service, and financial sectors.

The Government will conserve our natural resources, modernise the country, and nurture the quality of our human resources to a globally competitive level, so that our children match other countries and excel in an era characterised by new and advanced knowledge and technologies, innovative and emerging economies, progressive societies, and a new, modern phase of politics, that are well suited to the future realities of the new generations.

Honourable President of the National Assembly,

Looking ahead to the future, in the four years to come, the Government will establish new foundations and infrastructure for the country, underpinned by a robust and credible commitment to the rule of law. The Government is determined to work to achieve prompt and tangible outcomes on the basis of accuracy and correctness, transparency, and verifiability. This commitment extends to strict compliance with applicable laws and regulations, particularly in areas affecting natural resources, the environment, and the people's quality of life. The Government will place importance on public participatory processes.

In managing expenditures to implement the policies, the Government will be guided by goals related to economic growth, reducing inequality, and ensuring stability. The Government will place a strong emphasis on upholding the country's fiscal and financial disciplines, prioritising fiscal and financial stability in government spending. The Government's commitment is to continue spending efficiently and prudently, taking into account various funding sources, including the budget and external financing, such as loans and Public-Private Partnership in investments for national development. The Government will also explore alternative financial instruments to support policy implementation, alleviating the strain on the state budget and borrowing. At the same time, the Government is mindful of revenue limitations, particularly from national tax revenue. To address this, the Government will enhance the efficiency of tax collection as well as expedite efforts to promote trade, investment, and tourism in order to generate income for the people and support the expansion of the country's economy. This revenue will be returned into the tax system to sustain our policy initiatives.

Honourable President of the National Assembly,

In sum, the Government wishes to reassure both the National Assembly and the people of Thailand that the Government is fully committed to the transparent administration of state affairs, always acting in the best interest of our people and our country. The Government is resolute, intent and dedicated to implementing policies that will drive and elevate the level of development of the economy

and society, and enhance the quality of life for the Thai people, along with safeguarding our environment, in order to propel the country forward, ensuring that everyone enjoys a higher standard of living and increased incomes. The overarching goal of my government and I is to create a brighter future for all citizens, one that we can proudly pass on to our children and grandchildren.
