

Annual high-level UN Commission session to examine intersection of regional cooperation and 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development in Asia-Pacific

The 73rd session of the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP) opens on 15 May 2017, with countries set to discuss how greater economic cooperation and integration in the region can help achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Comprising two parts, the annual session will include the senior officials segment from 15 to 17 May, in preparation for the ministerial segment, which will be held from the afternoon of 17 May to 19 May at the UN Conference Centre in Bangkok.

The high-level dialogue of leaders in the morning of 18 May will provide a platform for countries to share their priorities and perspectives on regional economic cooperation as a means to achieving the SDGs. At the same time, there is strong recognition that the 2030 Agenda provides a sustainable approach for the region to become more closely integrated economically, and better connected through roads and other infrastructure, while ensuring the ability to rebound from natural disasters and other shocks to the system.

In the afternoon of 18 May, the Commission will take up the theme topic, 'Regional cooperation for sustainable energy.' Ministers will share their countries' policy approaches to ensuring access to energy sources, transitioning from traditional sources of energy and other collaborative opportunities they see ahead.
