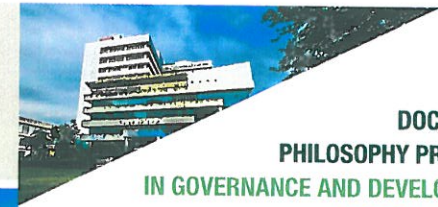

Program Objectives

The Ph.D. Program in Governance and Development (International) is designed to provide quality, relevant, and transformative education in governance, development and research aimed to develop highly competent, innovative and socially accountable professionals to become the new generation of leaders who are responsive to the needs of the local and international community. The program is conducted entirely in English and is available to international and Thai students.

Degree Requirements

A three to four-year study program, including 27 credit hours of graduate course study, passing a written Qualifying Examination for candidacy, 36 credit hours of dissertation, and an oral defense of the doctoral dissertation.

Selection Procedure

1. Consideration of application form and letters of recommendation.
2. Consideration of English proficiency test scores (TOEFL or IELTS).
3. Interview and/or assessment by the Ph.D. Program Executive Committee.

Class Schedule

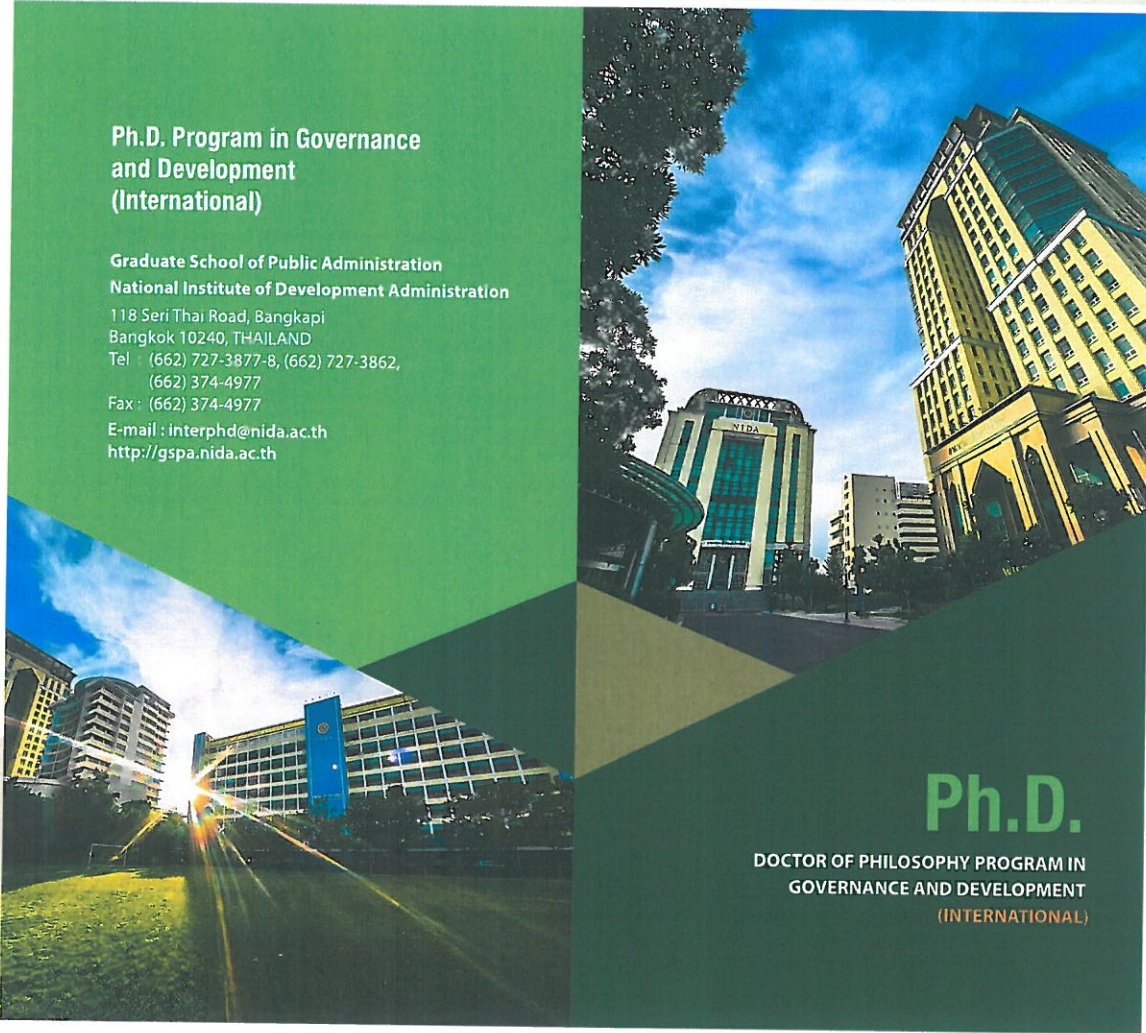
Classes are conducted on weekday evenings from 18.00 – 21.00 hrs.

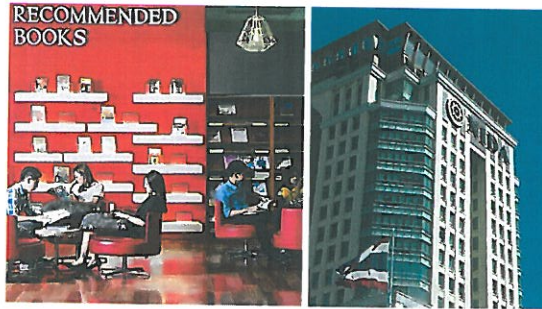

8. Copy of proof for a minimum TOEFL or IELTS as specified by NIDA's English language proficiency requirements

2. A late registration fee will be charged to students who do not register during the scheduled registration period. The fee is 1,500 baht.

3. Tuition fee for foreign graduate students are as follows:

3.1 Tuition fees for students who do not hold Thai citizenship.

- Doctor's level – 60,000 baht per person by splitting payments across 6 semesters.

3.2 Tuition fees for students who hold citizenship of an ASEAN country or a low income country based on the low – income countries from <https://data.worldbank.org/country/xn>.

- Doctor's level – 48,000 baht per person by splitting payments across 6 semesters.

3.3 In case a student requires less than the numbers of semesters for tuition fees payment, such student shall make full payment prior to completing his or her degree.
