Geographical Structures

Thailand is situated in Southeast Asia and has a land area of 513,115 square kilometers. It shares a border with Lao PDR and Cambodia at the east, and Malaysia and the Gulf of Thailand at the south. At the west are Myanmar and the Andaman Sea, and Myanmar and Lao PDR at the north.



Weather

Thailand has three main seasons. The summer months start around mid-February and end around mid-May. The rainy season begins around mid-May and lasts until mid-October. The cooler months are from mid-October to about mid-February. But since Thailand is situated in the tropical zone, the weather tends to be warm and humid year-round.

Halal Tourism - Readiness, Opportunity and Challenge

Thailand is outstanding in the field of tourism, thanks to its superb tourism structure and abundance in resources, which has generated major income for the country. The Halal tourism is considered a great opportunity which will also bring in revenue for the country and its local villages as the Muslim market is growing every day along with its increasing population around the world. According to statistics, it was found that Muslims around the world spend more on their travels even more than the Germans who are reputed to be the biggest spenders on traveling.

Thus, Thailand must be ready to facilitate the growing number of Muslim tourists who are planning to visit the kingdom in the near future. Also, the government's policy to encourage all sectors involved to procure the Halal standard and set a system to follow will certainly ensure convenience and contentment for Muslim tourists.

Among top priorities, there must be Halal food, a place for prayers, Muslim-friendly accommodations with the Qibla direction and a list of things to comply with the Muslim teachings such as no alcohol in the rooms and separate swimming pools for men and women.



TRAVELING TO THAILAND

1. Foreigners who wish to travel to Thailand must apply for an entry visa at the Thai Embassy or Consulate in their country of residence, or a Thai Embassy assigned to that country. Further information can be obtained from all Thai Embassies or the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

2. There are two groups of passport holders of certain nationals that are eligible to travel into the Kingdom of Thailand without an entry visa according to the agreement.

1) Citizens of countries who are exempted from obtaining a tourist entry visa are entitled to remain in the Kingdom for no more than 30 days.

2) Countries whose citizens do not require an entry visa into Thailand if they hold a specific type of passport including a diplomat passport, government official's passport or other types listed in the agreement.

3. Certain nationals are eligible for a visa on arrival and can remain in Thailand for 15 days or less.

4. Foreigners traveling from countries with a Yellow Fever Outbreak must show an International Health Certification on Yellow Fever Vaccination.

5. Requirement for a visa application into Thailand

- Passport with a minimum of 6 months prior to expiration.

- Documents to prove that the visitor will return to their country or the next destination (return ticket and visa).

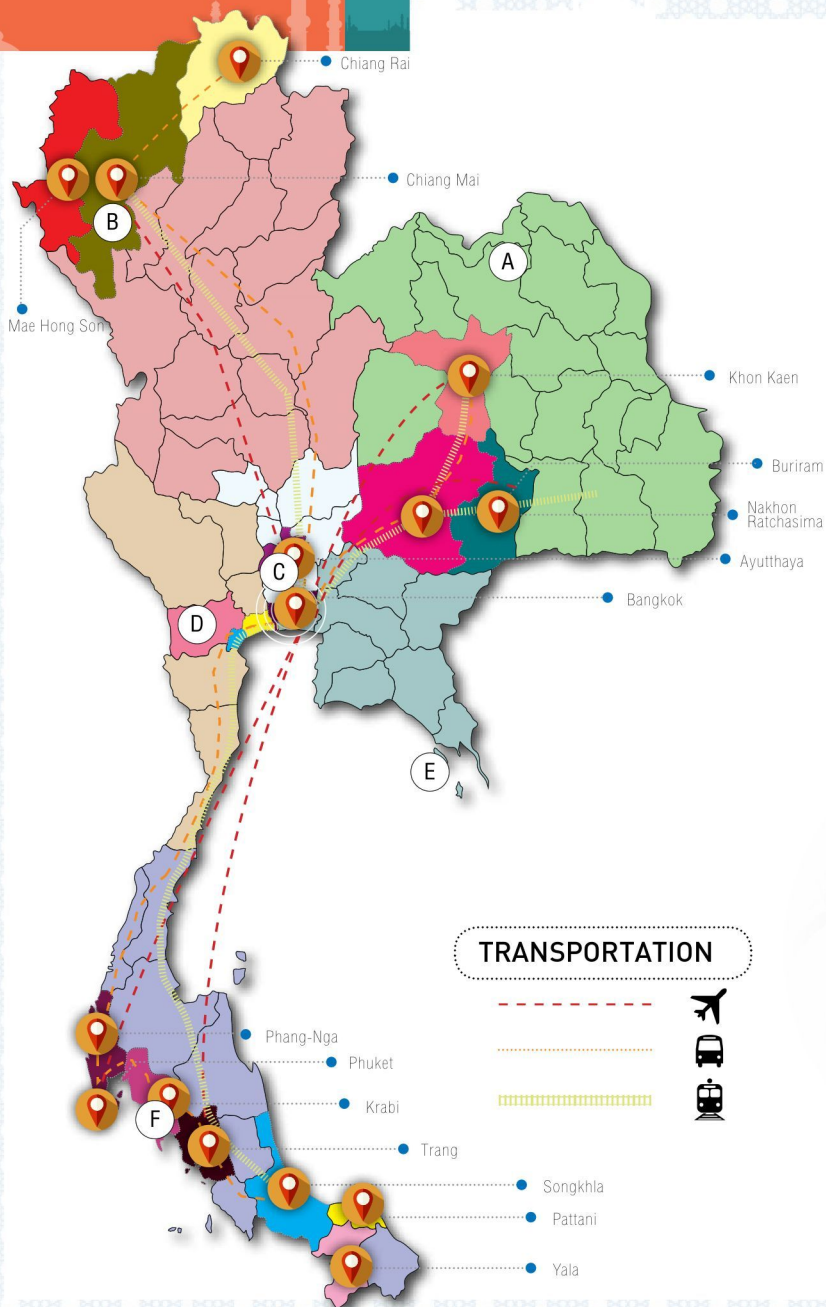
- The traveler must not be an individual banned from entering the Kingdom according to the Immigration Act of 1979. He/she may be required to show a minimum amount of cash, (for instance 20,000 THB.) for expenses incurred while residing in the Kingdom.

6. The purpose of visit must coincide with the visa application.

7. Travelers must check their visa validity and period of stay before entering Thailand to avoid complications. A fine of 500 THB. is charged per person per day of overstay. For more information, please call Tel. 02 141 9889 or log on to the website at 'www.bangkok.immigration.go.th'.

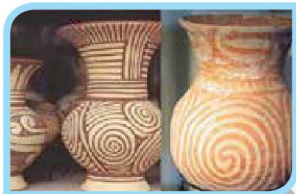
8. Foreign nationals traveling into the Kingdom are not allowed to work in the country without a work permit. For more information, please log onto the Ministry of Labour's website at www.mol.go.th.

9. Foreigners who have received an entry visa into the Kingdom by the Thai Embassy or Consulate may be refused entry by the Immigration Department if he/she is found to be in conflict with the Immigration Act of 1979.

Chiang Mai Night Safari

Chiang Mai

This Northern Province is another one of Thailand's most popular tourist destinations. It has a charming laidback atmosphere and unique Lanna culture entrenched in its people long before the kingdom was even unified as Siam. Chiang Mai is filled with lush mountains, fertile valleys, ancient temples and endless attractions to visit. Highlights include Doi Suthep, Night Bazaar, Hangdong handicrafts village, Weekend Walking Streets, Nimmahaemin Road, the Ping River, Khantoke dinner, Khaosoi noodles, elephant camps, Night Safari and more.



The Golden Triangle

Chiang Rai

Sharing borders with Laos and Myanmar, this northernmost province is a part of the famous Golden Triangle which was once a huge opium plantation. The Mae Khong River which separates Thai and Laos is a great place to see the local way of life of the people that live along its banks. Highlights include the Golden Triangle, the Kok River, the Mae Khong River and more.



Mae Hong Son

Located Northwest of Chiang Mai, Mae Hong Son is a small province to enjoy trekking and visit the hill-tribe villagers. Like in other provinces of northern Thailand, people love to wake up early to catch the amazing sea-mists that cover the forests just after sunrise. Highlights include Pang Mapa Cave, Mae La Noi Royal Project, Doi Mae U-Kor covered with Marigold flowers, watching the sunrise and sea-mist at Phu Chi Pur and more.

THE CENTRAL



Ayutthaya Historical Park

Ayutthaya

A province of historical importance in Thai history, Ayutthaya was the second capital of Siam after Sukhothai. The city became prosperous for hundreds of years, thanks to its strategic location by the Chaopraya River which made trading and commuting very convenient. Unfortunately, much of it was burned down by Burmese invaders in 1767, leaving most of the city in ruins. But still, it is a very magical place to visit. Highlights include cruising along the Chao phraya River, riding elephants or bicycles around ancient ruins, lunch by the river, visiting ancient temples and more.



Grand Palace

Bangkok

The vibrant, colorful and fascinating capital of Thailand offers visitors just about everything they could ever want. Thai culture is obviously very strong here and yet, there is a good mix of international influences which make visitors feel very comfortable and at home. There are myriads of Buddhist temples and Islamic Mosques among skyscrapers, shopping malls, Halal restaurants offering all kinds of different fares, Muslim-friendly hotels and a great deal of places to see and things to do. Highlights include cruising along the Chaopraya River, enjoying Thai and international Halal food, go shopping at bargain markets all the way to high-end shopping malls in Pratunam and Rajprasong areas, watching live Thai cultural shows and so much more.

Sukhumvit – Ramkamhaeng

Sukhumvit Road is lined with shopping malls, restaurants and unique individually owned shops where visitors can conveniently reach by BTS sky train. This area is very popular among foreigners residing in Thailand although the biggest hub for Middle East residents living in Thailand is in Nana Alley or Sukhumvit Soi 3. Ramkamhaeng Road is another favorite part of Bangkok for Islam visitors as there are many choices of restaurants and hotels that cater to Muslim guests.

Kanchanaburi

3 hours' drive away from Bangkok is Kanchanaburi, a province most famous for the Death Railway and the Bridge over the River Kwai built during World War 2. Apart from the natural riverside serenity and vistas, it is a nice place to learn a bit about the significant part of gruesome history that went on here. Highlights include the Bridge over the River Kwai, Srinakarin Dam, the Kwai River, gliding down the river on bamboo rafts, the POW War Cemetery and more.

Mae Glong-Damnoensaduak

Located close to Bangkok and can be visited on a day trip are the Rom Hoob (Folding Umbrella) Market of Mae Glong and Damnoensaduak Floating Market. These places are great for experiencing the local Thai way of life up close. The market of Mae Glong is set right over the train track so vendors have to gather their things and fold their umbrellas everytime the train passes. And the floating market of Damnoen Saduak portrays the old Thai way of life from the time cars were not yet the main mode of transportation. Back then, it was convenient to travel and sell goods by boat via rivers and canals since people's houses were built along the banks and close by. Highlights include the sights and sounds of local markets and the goods being sold.

THE NORTHEAST



Panomrung Historical Park

Korat, Buriram

These Isan provinces in northeastern Thailand are the land of Khmer Influences dating back over a thousand years. Visitors often come here to see the amazing stone castles similar to Angkor Wat in Cambodia. Highlights include Korat Zoo, Pimai Stone Castle, Khaoyai National Park, Wangnamkiew, Panomrung Historical Park, Muang Tham Castle and more.

Betong is the southernmost district in Thailand located 140 kilometers from Yala city center. It has a mountainous topography which attracts visitors who wish to witness the beautiful morning sea-mists. Highlights include Gunung Silipat Mountain, Taepusu Suspension Bridge, Rafting in Aiyoe Weng, King Rama 5 Waterfall, Hala Bala Wildlife Sanctuary, Betong Botanical Garden and more.

The largest town in Songkhla Province and fourth largest city in Thailand, Hat Yai is vibrant destination very popular among Malaysian, Singapore and Indonesian tourists. It is located on the Southern Gulf Coast and is a great place for shopping and dining. Halal food is also plentiful as there are a good number of Muslims tourists and residents in that area. Highlights include Kimyong Market, Tone Nga Chang Waterfall, Klong Hae Floating Market, Suntisuk Market and more.

Krabi

A top destination for beach lovers, Krabi Province is located on the Andaman side or Thailand's Southwest coast. It is home to some of the most stunning beaches and islands in the world, not to mention lush, natural attractions further inland. Highlights include the Central Masjid, Emerald Pool, Hot Waterfall, Parting Sea, Railay Beach, Maya Bay, Hong Islands, Viking Cave, Tham Lod Cave, Tham Klang Cave, Poda Island, Gai Island and so much more.

Nakhon Si Thammarat

The second largest city in southern Thailand, Nakhon Si Thammarat is 780 kilometers from Bangkok on the Gulf of Thailand. It has a long history dating back to the Ligor Kingdom before the country even became Siam and was an important center of ancient Buddhism. Highlights include Mahathat Wora Mahawiharn Temple, Uncle Suchart's Talung Puppet House, Kiriwong Village for Homestay in a natural environment, 100-year old Pak Panang Market, Kanom Beach and the southern islands and more.

Pattani

One of the southernmost provinces of Thailand, Pattani is located between Songkhla and Yala Provinces. Muslim influence is very strong here as the province is home to the biggest and most beautiful Masjid in Thailand. Highlights include Lim Gor Niew Goddess Shrine, Changhai Temple, Pattani Central Masjid, Dato's House Masjid, Krue Se Masjid, Sai Khao Waterfall National Park, Kae Kae Beach and more.



Tapu Island

Phang Nga

One of the top scuba diving sites in the world can be found around the islands off the coast of Phang Nga. And even if you're not a dive enthusiast, it is still a lot of fun to go snorkeling and be surrounded by amazing marine species and fascinating coral reefs. Highlights include the Similan Islands, Tachai Island, Tapu Island (James Bond Island), Panyee Island, Surin Islands National Park, Khaolak, Yao Noi / Yao Yai Islands and more.



Phi Phi Island

Phuket

The biggest Island in Thailand, Phuket is another paradise for those who want to spend time in some of the most picturesque beaches and islands on earth. This is because Phuket itself is surrounded by countless smaller islands fringed with clear blue water which is the habitat of beautiful coral reefs and all kinds of marine lives. The island itself offers heavenly beaches on all sides and they have different atmospheres, from peaceful and tranquil to vibrant and lively. Highlights include Patong Beach, Kamala Beach, watching the sunset on Laem Promthep, Kata Beach, Karon Beach, Rawai Beach, Coral Island, Phi Phi Islands and more.

Samui

Thailand's second largest island after Phuket, Samui is another well-loved holiday destination of Thailand. It lies about 35 Kilometers off the shores of Suratthani in the Gulf of Thailand and has beautiful Islands nearby to enjoy snorkeling and scuba diving. You will find everything from low-budget bungalows to luxurious hotels and resorts and beaches that are lively, serene or in between. Highlights

include Tao Island, Nangyuan Island, Chaweng Beach, Lamaï Beach, Bophut Beach, Na Muang Waterfall, Big Buddha Temple, Grandma- Grandpa Rock and more.

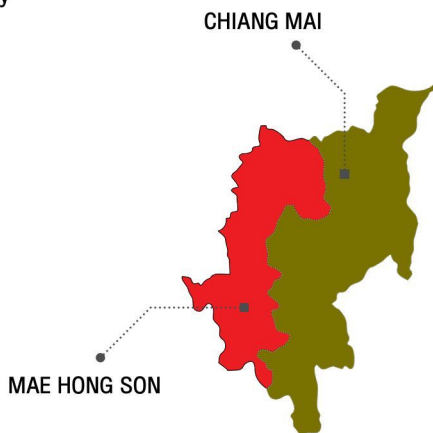

Highlights:

Chiang Mai is a great family holiday destination because there is so much everyone can enjoy together. This popular northern province is mountainous which means the weather is nice and cool most of the year, especially higher up in the mountains. There are valleys, waterfalls, caves and fertile forests to explore and unique culture to experience. And since it is a fairly large city, you can be sure to find all the conveniences and facilities of a cosmopolitan city while at the same time enjoy its unique, age-old tradition. The road between Pai and Mae Hong Son is filled with winding curves and very scenic.

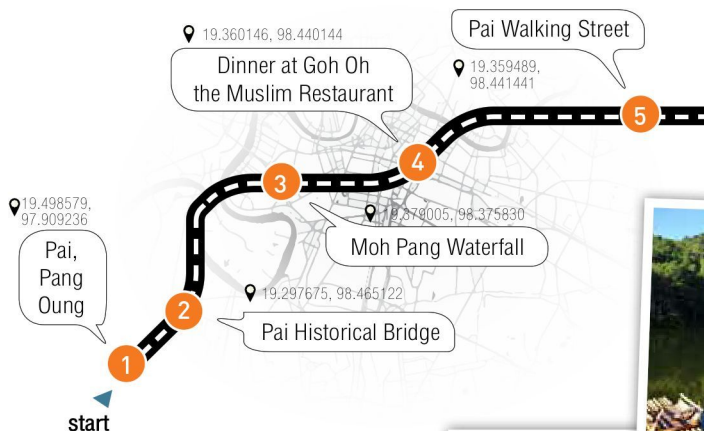




Mae Hong Son is located at the Northwest corner of Thailand, 924 kilometers from Bangkok, where it shares a border with Myanmar on the left and Chiang Mai province on the right. It is characterized by winding mountains covered in sea-mists all through the colder months (hence the nickname ‘City of Three Mists’) which visitors find very appealing and romantic. This northwest province is the least densely populated in the country and is largely inhabited by hill-tribe villagers whose ancestors migrated from the neighboring country, Myanmar. The province’s charm lies in its misty, dreamy quality that is unique of the north and the fact that it is not too spoiled by modernization.

day 1

Pang Oung/ Santichon Village/ Pai Historical Bridge/ Pai Hot Spring/ Walking Street



08:00 Hrs. - Pai District located towards the north of Mae Hong Son Province is a lovely little town which has become very popular in the past decade. Make the first stop at Pang Oung early in the morning to catch the sea mist over the lake.

10:00 Hrs. - Stop by Santichol Village, a small Yunan Chinese Village that still keeps their people's tradition.

11:00 Hrs. - Make a stop at Pai Historical Bridge built during World War 2 by Japanese troops as a means of transportation into Burma.

12:00 Hrs. - Enjoy lunch with gorgeous views of the landscape at Armena Restaurant 6 kilometers from Pai City. Address: 1095 Mae Hong Son. Tel. 089 788 7066.

14:00 Hrs. - Visit Moh Pang Waterfall located just a few kilometers from Pai city.

15:00 Hrs. - Afterwards, make a stop at Pai Hot Spring with water temperature of 80 degree Celsius, hot enough to cook soft-boiled eggs.

19:00 Hrs. - Dinner at the Muslim restaurant in front of Pai Masjid downtown followed by cakes at Goh Oh, a Muslim bakery.

20:00 Hrs. - When in Pai, be sure to stroll around its Walking Street located right in the heart of Pai City. This is a great place to buy souvenirs, clothes, handmade jewelry and enjoy food and drinks located along the street. There is a very famous Roti vendor called Gomusa Roti where everyone comes to enjoy the Cheese Roti.

08:00 Hrs. - First stop is at Wat Prathat Doi Kong Mu, an ancient temple which has been the place of worship for Mae Hong Son locals for a long time. The architecture is in Mon style and you can see panoramic views of Mae Hong Son from up there.

10:00 Hrs. - Visit the Karen Long-Necked Hill-tribe village at Baan Huay Sua Tao, Baan Nam Piang Din or Baan Nai Soy. These minority groups of Burmese people migrated across the border to Thailand from Myanmar when a war broke out between them and the Burmese government and they still keep their tradition until today.

12:00 Hrs. - Lunch at the Muslim restaurant in front of Pang Lor Temple.

14:00 Hrs. - Visit Tham Lod Cave located in Pang Ma Pa District where you have to ride the bamboo raft to see the inside of the cave. Its length is about one kilometer and is filled with beautiful stalactites and stalagmites. Evidence shows that this cave was inhabited by humans some 2,000 years ago.

19:00 Hrs. - Enjoy local scenes at the Walking Street located near Chong Klang-Chong Kham Temple. There are two zones, food zone and shopping zone and it is open from 6pm. To 10pm.

14:00 Hrs. - Explore the hip and artistic side of Chiang Mai around Nimmarnhaemin Street lined with shops, cafes and restaurants.

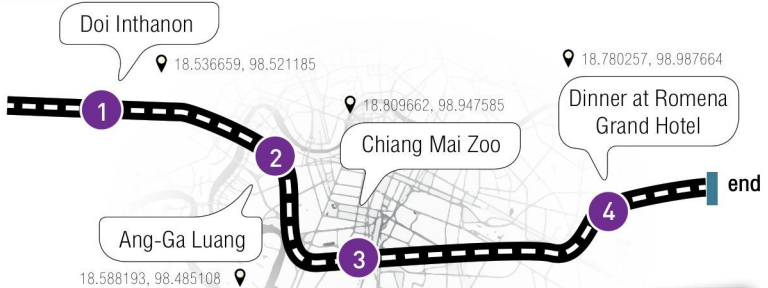
18:30 Hrs. - Dinner at Ban Pi Huen Nong Halal Khantoke. While in Chiang Mai, take

day 4

Doi Inthanon/ Ang-Ga Luang/ Giew Mae Paan/ Chiang Mai Zoo



08:00 Hrs. - A fun family activity surrounded by nature is trekking in an ancient forest along the Ang-Ga Luang Nature Trail on Inthanon Mountain. This trail is quite short, only 300 meters, so it is perfect if you have less time. Inthanon Mountain is the tallest in Thailand so the weather up there is cool year-round and is very beautiful and fertile so for those who really wish to enjoy a longer trek, Giew Mae Paan is a must.

11:00 Hrs. - Enjoy breath-taking views along Giew Mae Paan trail located on the 42 km. up to Doi Inthanon. Along the trail, you will see vast open fields, thick forests, streams, wild flowers and gorgeous views of the mountains. Afterwards, don't forget to travel further up to take pictures with the "Highest Point in Thailand" sign.

14:30 Hrs. - Make a stop at the vast Chiang Mai Zoo and say hello to Lin Hui and Chuang Chuang, the giant pandas residing at the zoo. This zoo is quite spacious and very pleasant to take a leisure stroll around. There are all kinds of animal species from around the world plus families can enjoy animal shows several times daily. HOW TO GET THERE



By Car: To get from Bangkok to Chiang Mai by car, it normally takes an average of 8-9 hours. The most direct route to take is via tollway passing Donmuang Airport leading to VibhavadeeRangsit Road. From there, take highway number 32 passing Ayutthaya and Singburi then change to highway number 1 leading to Chiang Mai and Mae Hong Son.



By Bus: The Mochit Northern Bus Terminal in Chatuchak District offers bus transfers between Bangkok and Chiang Rai/ Chiang Mai several times daily. Travel time is around 9.5-10 hours with overnight buses being the preferred choice. The VIP bus fare costs around 850+ THB. per person.



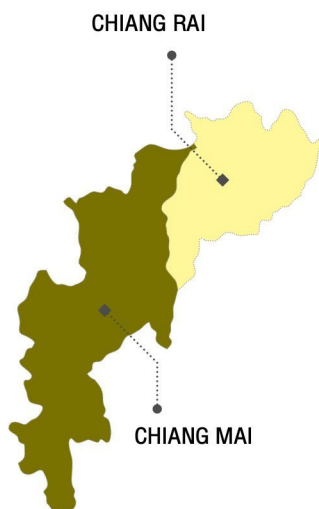
By Train: Hualumphong Train Station offers several train rides to Chiang Rai and Chiang Mai daily. Travel time is around 13 hours and costs for overnight, air-conditioned sleeper trains are approximately 1,200+ - 1,400+ THB. per person. By Air: Chiang Rai and Chiang Mai can be reached several times daily via Thai Airways International from Bangkok's Suvarnabhumi Airport and via Nok Air and Air Asia from Donmuang Airport.

Highlights:

Situated approximately 700 kilometers north of Bangkok, **Chiang Mai** is the largest city in Northern Thailand and ranks among the Kingdom's top tourist destinations. It was a former capital of the Lanna Kingdom during 1296-1768 and became a part of Siam in 1775 after King Taksin drove out the invading Burmese troops. Today, Chiang Mai is a charming province with

rich Lanna culture still embedded in its roots and is blessed with tall mountains and stunning valleys, ancient temples and is absolutely brimming with endless interesting attractions. Its excellent choice of beautiful hotels and an abundance in food choices make it one of the destinations not-to-be-missed, both by Thai and foreign tourists.



Chiang Rai Province is situated northeast of Chiangmai and is the northern-most province of Thailand. It shares a border with Myanmar to the north and Laos to the east thus creating the Golden Triangle which, at one time, was the hub for growing opium. Today, it is one of the top tourist attractions of the north where visitors come to enjoy a boat ride along the scenic Mekong River.

8:30 Hrs. - Take a scenic car ride up to Chiang Mai's iconic Prathat Doi Suthep Mountain and get a good work out climbing some 300 steps of staircase to get to the temple at the top. Once there, you can enjoy a panoramic view of the entire Chiang Mai city. (For those who prefer not to walk up the steps, they can get to the top by taking the tram ride for a small fee).

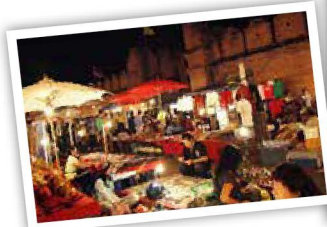

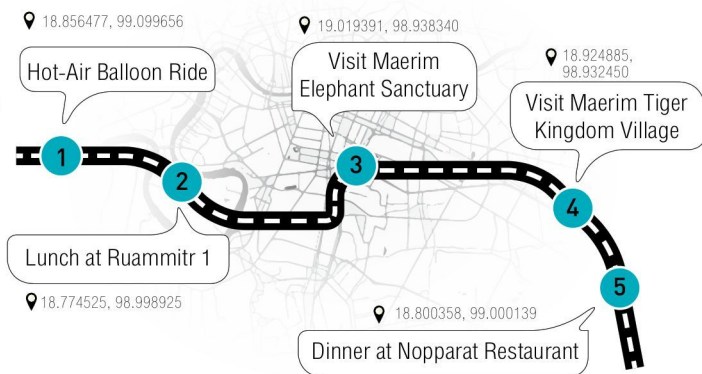

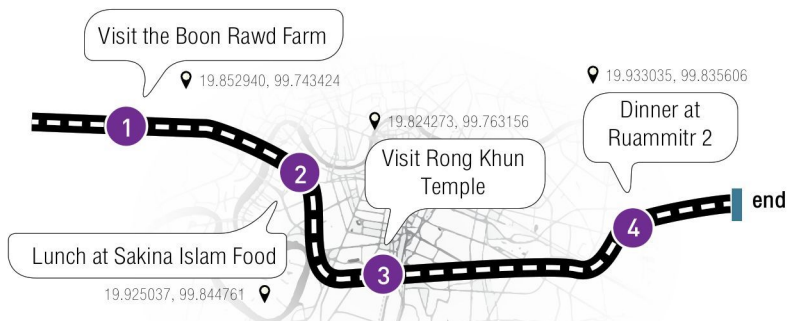

HOW TO GET THERE



By Car: To get from Bangkok to Chiang Mai by car, it normally takes an average of 8-9 hours. The most direct route to take is via tollway passing Donmuang Airport leading to Vibhavadee Rangsit Road. From there, take highway number 32 passing Ayutthaya and Singburi then change to highway number 1 leading to Chiang Mai.



By Bus: The Mochit Northern Bus Terminal in Chatuchak District offers bus transfers between Bangkok and Chiangrai/ Chiang Mai several times daily. Travel time is around 9.5-10 hours with overnight buses being the preferred choice. The VIP bus fare costs around 850+THB. per person.

Highlights:

The central region of Thailand has more to offer than just Bangkok and great shopping opportunities. There is so much to be explored and vibrant sights to be seen, not to mention fascinating history and the way of life of the people going about their chores. Take for instance the Mae Glong Market where trains run through several times daily

and vendors must be quick to pick up their things before the train gets to them. There is also the floating market of Damnoen Saduak where vendors have been selling good on their paddle boats for over a hundred years.



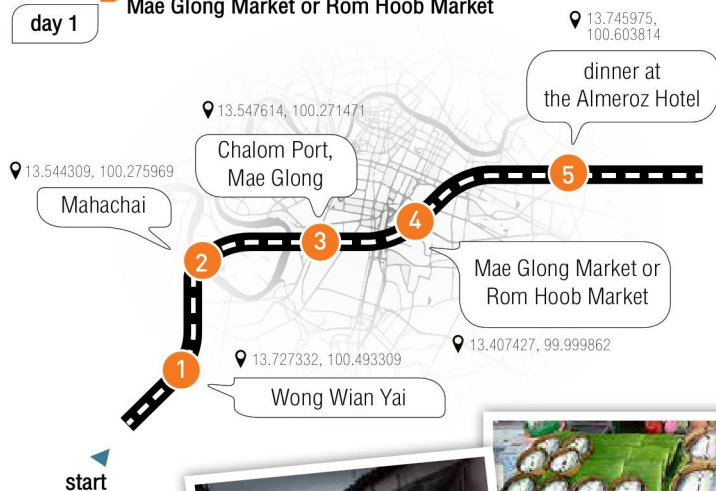
A little further away just 120 kilometers west of Bangkok is Kanchanaburi, another fascinating place to visit. What today appears to be a serene province with the Kwai River running through was once the site of a gruesome scene when the Imperial Japanese Army had prisoners of War (Australian, Dutch, British soldiers among others) build the “Death Railway”

leading to Burma. The railway got its name because over a hundred thousand lives were lost during the 16 months of construction which took place from 1942 to 1943. Close to the famous “Bridge of the River Kwai” is the Kanchanaburi War Cemetery where nearly 7,000 Australian, English and Dutch prisoners of wars are buried.

05:50 Hrs. - Mae Glong Market or Rom Hoob Market (Folding Umbrellas Market), located in Samut Songkram Municipality, is a unique market unlike any other in the world. This is because there are trains literally running through the market and vendors have to close their parasols and pick up their goods

day 1

quickly to make way for the passing train. To witness this remarkable sight, you need to catch the train from Wong Wian Yai and reach Mahachai by 6:23 am. then catch a boat to Chalom Port to get on a train from Baan Laem, reaching Mae Glong around 8:30 am. Try to get on the last bogie because you will get to see more action that happens while the train passes through the market (which goes back and forth eight times per day). There are lots to buy and eat here and this is truly one of the local scenes that actually go on every day.

18:00 Hrs. - For dinner, treat yourself to a real Halal feast at the Almeroz Hotel located on Ramkamhaeng Road. All three restaurants, Papyrus, Diwan and Bakarar, are all Halal-certified so you can enjoy your meal to the fullest.

day 2

Damnoen Saduak Floating market / Pratunam



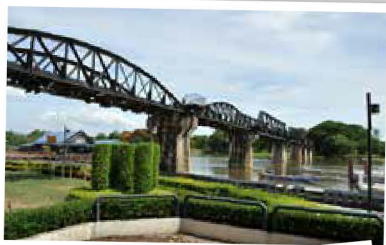
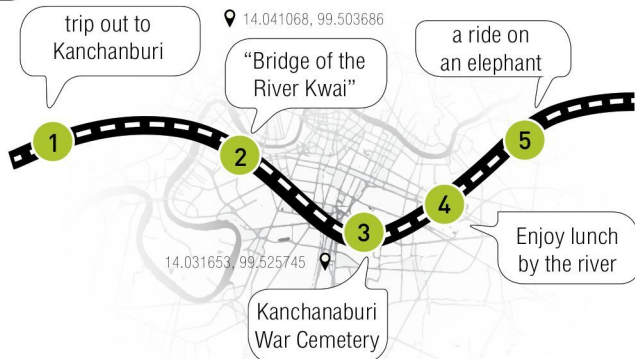
05:30 Hrs. -It takes about an hour and a half from Bangkok to get to Ratchaburi's Damnoen Saduak Floating Market where local scenes of vendors selling goods on their paddle boats can be seen. The canal where the market takes place was dug up during the reign of King Rama 4 whose intention was to join Mae Glong and Tha Chine Rivers together for the convenience of traveling by boat. The market takes place from 08:00 am. until noon and you can find all sorts of goods including food, fruits, local handicrafts, etc. here. For a nice little tour of the vicinity, try hiring a paddle boat or motor boat which take visitors on a 45 minute tour to taste fresh, aromatic palm juice, a popular local product of this area.

15:00 Hrs. -After a morning of fascinating cultural tour, the afternoon calls for some shopping. Head back into the heart of Bangkok in Pratunam area and shop till you drop at Platinum Mall and local shops nearby. This area is known for bargain shopping and you will find all sorts of fashion items, souvenirs and more at great prices.

19:00 Hrs. -Walk over just next door to the Grand Diamond Suites Hotel for a nice dinner at Halal Restaurant. Here, you can enjoy flavors of the East and West like Chicken Samosa, pasta and pizza. For more information, please visit 'www.granddiamondsuites.com'.

day 3

River Kwai/ Death Railway/ POW Cemetery



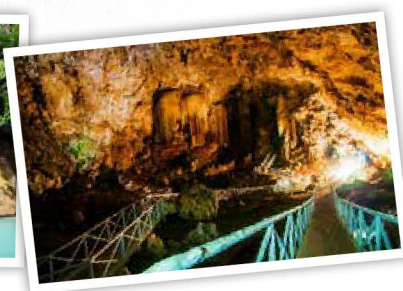
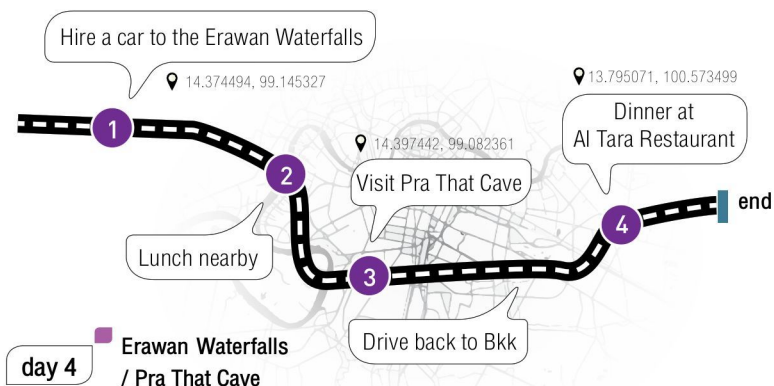
07:00 Hrs. -Take a road trip out to Kanchanaburi to enjoy the scenes along the Kwai River and learn about a part of history that took place here during World War II. The first attraction to visit in Kanchanaburi is the "Bridge of the River Kwai" which is now a top tourist spot. You can take a walk over the bridge and imagine the scenes that went on right here in the 1940's. Just further down the other end of the bridge, you might wish to visit the Kanchanaburi War Cemetery where POWs are buried.

10:30 Hrs. -Visit Mallika City and get a glimpse of how Thailand was in the year 1905. Guests can enjoy browsing around the market zone, see beautiful old style wooden houses of the noblemen and servant quarters, farmers tending to the rice

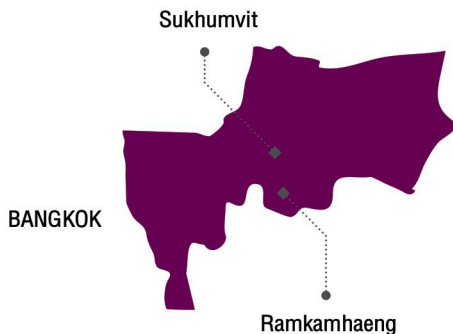

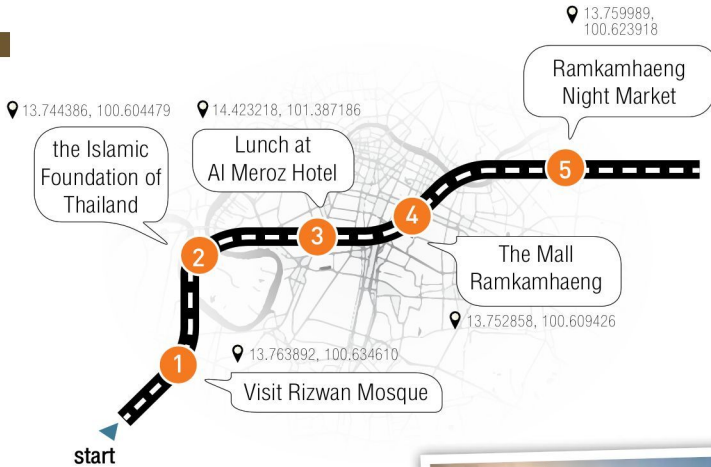
of the best hospitals in Bangkok and is widely visited by patients from the Middle East.

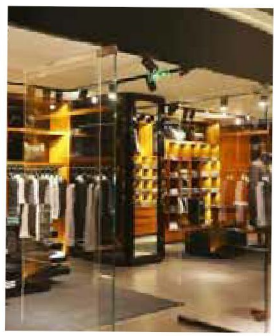

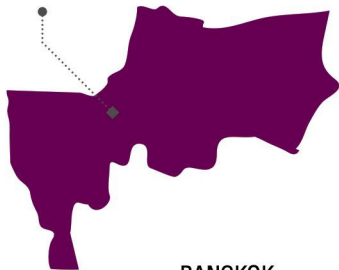
MRT Subway: The MRT underground train system also links up with the BTS Sky Trains so that most areas of Bangkok can be reached easily.

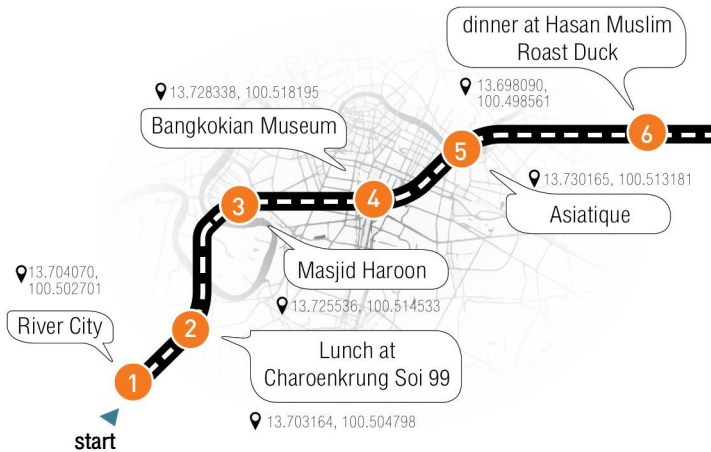

10:00 Hrs. - For antique collectors, River City is a riverside shopping complex with many individual shops selling antiques from around Asia and Thailand. This is a great place if you are looking for carved wood furniture, antiques and imported items from around Southeast Asia.

12:30 Hrs. - This day is dedicated to sampling Halal food and enjoying shopping and culture in general. Bangkok household before and after World War 2. Here, you can see the type of furniture used back then and the atmosphere of how it was like back then.

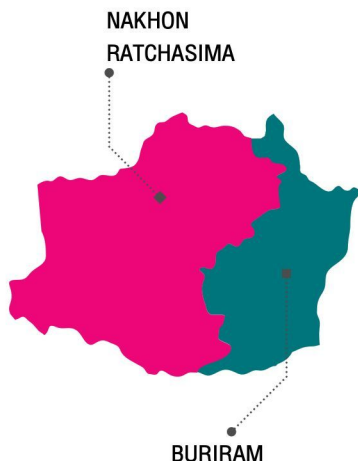

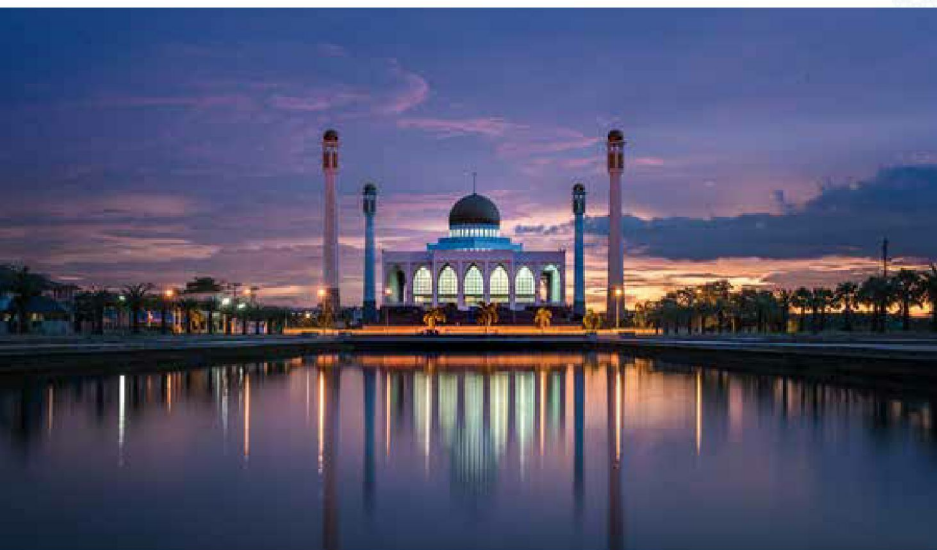


Highlights:

Hat Yai City in Songkhla Province is a vibrant town 946 Kilometers south of Bangkok. It is the largest city in the province and the south of Thailand, which is why it is often mistaken as the provincial capital. Many Thais and foreigners, especially from neighboring countries, come here to enjoy shopping as there are numerous malls, restaurants and markets such as Suntisook Market on Nipat Uthit Road and Kim Yong Market right in the center of Hat Yai.

Sharing a border with Malaysia, Yala is the southernmost province of Thailand. Its population consists of 75% Muslims and its prominent landmark is the Central Mosque located on Kanchana 1 Road. For some outdoor fun, there is the Yala Waterpark to enjoy cooling off on a hot day, but if you wish to experience unspoiled nature, Betong District is where you want to go.

Betong, the southernmost district of Thailand has a land area of 1,328 sq. km.



and is located 140 km. from Yala city on Sankalakhiri Mountain Range. Its highest point on Khao Luang, is at 1,533 meters above sea level around the border between Betong and Malaysia. 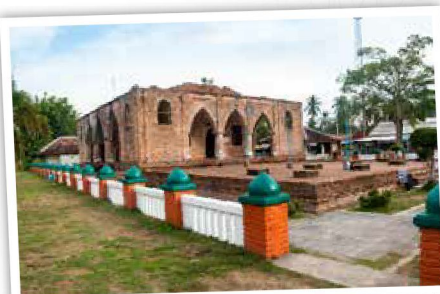

08:00 Hrs. - Tone Nga Chang Waterfall is a majestic seven-tiered waterfall located within Tone Nga Chang Wildlife Sanctuary of Tambol Tungtamsao. Of the seven tiers, the third is the prettiest as the water is separated into two falls, resembling two elephant tusks (Nga Chang). Visitors can enjoy nature trails and hike up one kilometer to reach the top tier.

10:30 Hrs. - Klonghae Floating Market is the first floating market of southern Thailand. It has a lovely, traditional Thai atmosphere with more than 400 vendors selling food, local handicrafts, souvenirs, etc. Here, they try to stick to the basics by using coconut shells instead of plates and bamboos trunks instead of cups. Klong Hae Floating Market is located at Klong Hae Temple's Pier in Tambol Klong Hae, Hat Yai.

12:00 Hrs. - Lunch at Hat Yai Holiday Hotel's New York Restaurant on Chivanusorn Road or Hat Yai Paradise Hotel and Resort's Ton Fern Restaurant on Raj Uthit Road

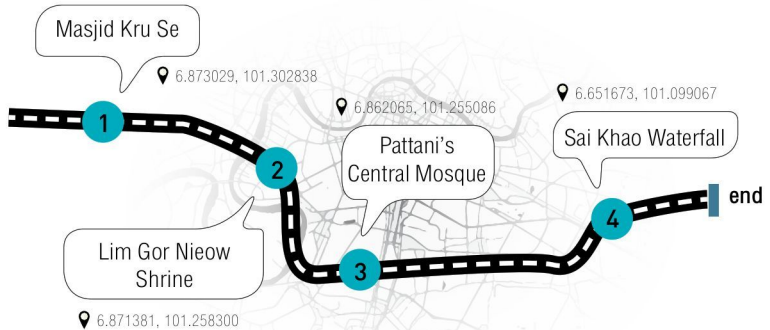
13:30 Hrs. - Browse through Hat Yai's iconic Kim Yong Market on Supasan Road where you can buy clothing, snacks, toys, and local goods.

16:00 Hrs. - continue with more shopping at Suntisook Market on Thammanoon Vithee Road. This is a newer but also very popular market which offers all types of products including makeup, electronic goods, etc.

day 2

Pattani's Masjid Krue Se/ Pattani Central Masjid/ Lim Gor Niew Shrine/ Sai Khao Waterfall



08:00 Hrs. - Visit Pattani's classic and iconic Masjid Kru Se. Its construction began over 200 years ago during the Ayut-thaya period and features pointed arch entrance in Gothic style. But for some strange reason, however, it was never completed until today. The masjid is located in Tambol Tan-yong Luloh, Amphur Muang.

10:00 Hrs. - Visit the nearby Lim Gor Niew Shrine with a fascinating story. Lim Gor Niow was a Chinese lady who promised her sick mother that she would come to Siam to find her brother and bring him home. Her brother, who was to look after the construction of Masjid Kru Se, refused to go back so she put a curse on the masjid that it shall never to be completed and killed herself. The shrine is a landmark of Pattani province until today.

13:30 Hrs. - Visit Pattani's Central Mosque, the biggest and most beautiful masjid in Thailand. It was built in 1954 on over three rais of land and took almost nine years to complete. Inspired by the Taj Mahal of India, it features a pond in front and large green dome surrounded by four smaller ones. Pattani Central Mosque is located on Yarang Road.

15:00 Hrs. - For an afternoon amid the forest, go to Sai Khao Waterfall National Park in Amphur Kokepoh. This natural attraction is a 40-meter high waterfall with several tiers whose water originates from Khao Nang Chan. There is a concrete path of about 400 meters leading to the waterfall surrounded by lush green forest that make a nice stroll.

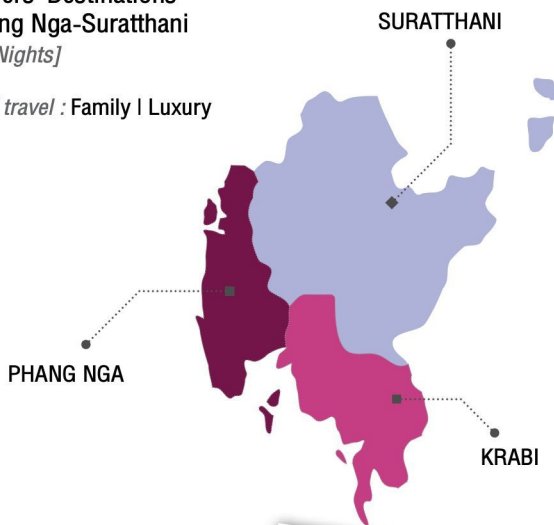

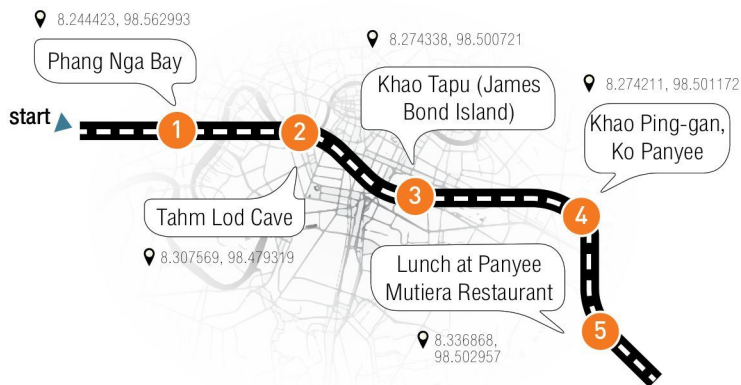
is a good base to explore attractions around Krabi and this is where you can find many hotels, shops and restaurants.

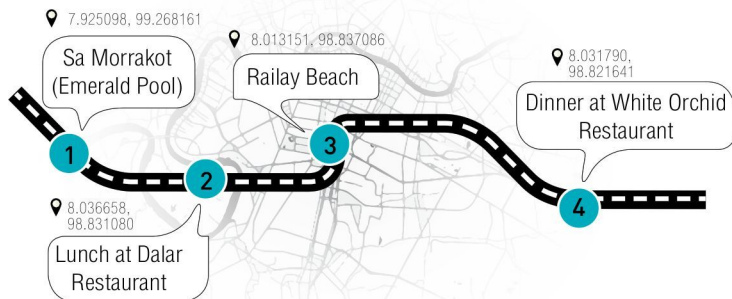

Tom Nua, 28 kilometers from Krabi city center. Once you get to the entrance, you can enjoy an 800 meter trek through beautiful lush jungle filled with a variety of bird species.

Highlights:

Songkhla Province shares a border with Malaysia at the south and has a population of approximately 75% Buddhists and 25% Muslims. 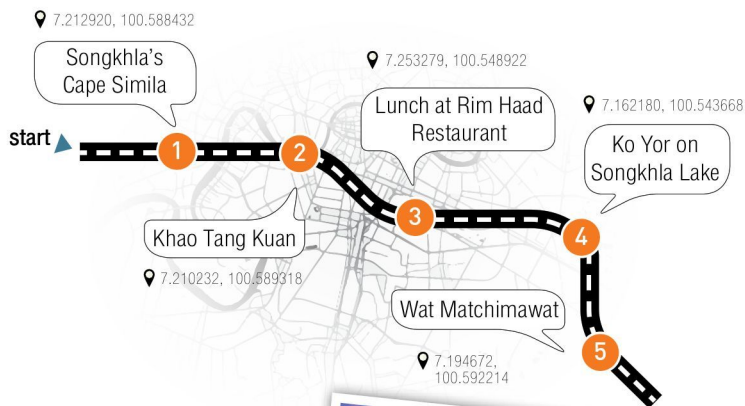

Songkhla's Cape Simila/ Khao Tang Kuan/ Ko Yor/ Wat Matchimawat



09:00 Hrs. - Cape Samila Beach with the mermaid statue is the most popular beach of Songkhla. It has white sands and is lined with pine trees. From here, Cat and Mouse Islands can be seen. According to legend, a cat, mouse and dog were traveling on a ship together. As they swam to shore, the cat and mouse drowned and their bodies turned into two islands. The dog who made it to the shore also died and became Tang Kuan Mountain.

10:30 Hrs. - Tang Kuan Mountain has a height of 2,000 ft. above sea level where, from the top, you can see panoramic views of Songkhla city. It is also home to the Prathat Chedi of Songkhla built during the Nakhon Si Thammarat Empire in Tawarawadee architectural style.

12:00 Hrs. - Lunch at Rim Haad Restaurant at Haad Kaew Resort. Add: 163 Moo 1, Chiang Kao, Sing Nakhon. Tel: +6674 331 058-67

13:30 Hrs. - Yor Island on Songkhla Lake can be reached via Tinsulanond Bridge, the longest concrete bridge in Thailand with total length of 2,640 meters. Hand woven cloth of Yor Island is reputed to be of good quality and has unique design patterns.

16:00 Hrs. - Visit the most important Buddhist temple of the province, Wat Matchimawat (also known as Wat Klang), located on Saiburi Road in Songkhla city.

day 2

Nakhon Si Thammarat's Wat Phra Mahathat Voramahavihan/ Kiriwong Village/ Krung Ching Waterfall/ Khaoluang National Park



09:00 Hrs. - Visit Phra Mahathat Voramahavihan Temple, the most prominent temple of Nakhon Si Thammarat which houses a tooth relic of Buddha. It is located on Ratchadamnoen Road in Muang District and was first constructed almost two thousand years ago.

10:00 Hrs. - Visit Kiriwong Village in Lanska District at the foothill of Khao Luang. Here, the villagers still live a simple life like in the old days. They tend to their fruit orchards, herb gardens, weaving and making handicrafts from coconut shells.

12:00 Hrs. - Lunch at Nanjing Chinese Restaurant in Twin Lotus Hotel. For more information, please visit www.twin-lotushotel.net

13:30 Hrs. - Khao Luang National Park is set on a mountain which makes a great place to enjoy hiking. There are over 300 species of wild orchids in the forest, a must for orchid lovers.



15:00 Hrs. - Stop by Krung Ching Waterfall in Khaoluang National Park. It has seven tiers of water gushing down year-round. To get there, you must hike 3.7 kilometer on foot.

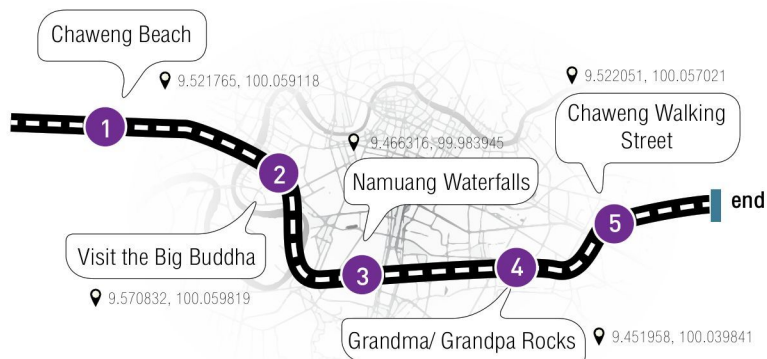

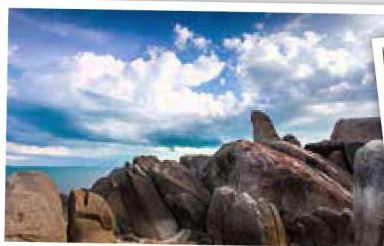

16:00 Hrs. - Grandma/ Grandpa Rocks (Hin Ta/ Hin Yai) located near the traditional Muslim Fishing Village Hua Thanon are two natural rock formations located close to each other. The part which makes them stand out is that they are in the shape of the male and female genitalia.

18:00 Hrs. - Take a stroll around Chaweng Walking Street and enjoy shopping, dining and basically enjoy the relaxing ambiance.

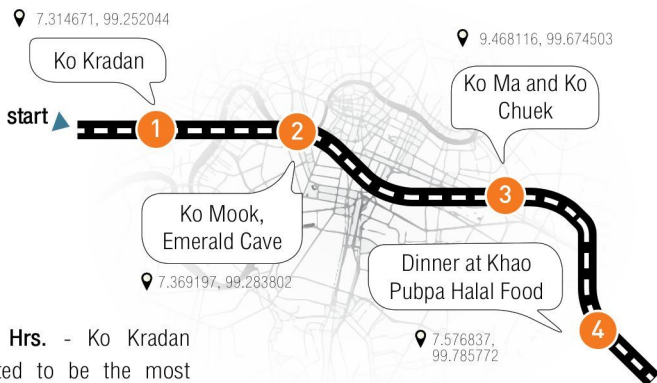
Highlights:

Trang Province is home to 46 islands and was an important trading post in the past. Beautiful Sino-Portuguese architecture from the bygone era can still be seen in the old parts of town and the last train station on the Andaman side, Kantang, is also located in the province. Trang is also home to the first rubber tree in Thailand which was brought over from Indonesia over a hundred years ago.

Satun is located south of Trang and is the southernmost province on the Andaman side. It is a small and quiet province with a lot of beautiful islands off its coast. Some of these include Lipe Island, Tarutao Marine National Park, Kai Island, Adang-Rawi Islands, Petra Island and more.

day 1

Trang's Tham Morrakot/ Ko Mook/ Ko Kradan/ Ko Rok/ Ko Chuek/Ko Ma



09:00 Hrs. - Ko Kradan is reputed to be the most beautiful island in Trang's water. The island has powdery sand and shallow, clear water where coral reefs and colorful fish can be seen.

10:30 Hrs. - Ko Mook is home to the Emerald Cave (Tham Morrakot), a beautiful cave with tiny entrance which can only be entered or exited by swimming through during

low tide. Once inside, you have to follow the person in front closely through 80 meters of total darkness to reach an open lagoon surrounded by limestone cliffs. The cave got its name because the whole entrance area would light up like sparkling green emerald when sunlight shines through. Tham Morrakot is 40 minutes by boat from Pak Meng Pier.

14:00 Hrs. - Ko Ma and Ko Chuek located between Ko Mook and Ko Ngai are the best places to go snorkeling and scuba diving as they have the most beautiful coral reefs in Trang. There are no beaches on the two islands and the current is quite strong so you have to hold on to the ropes (Cheuk in Thai language) which is how it got its name.

18:00 Hrs. - Dinner at Khao Pubpa Halal Food with magnificent mountain view. The restaurant is located on the main road on the way to Trang in Khao Pubpa area. Add: 89 Moo 7, Trang-Pattalung, Chong, Na Yong, Trang.



day 2

Sino-Portuguese Architectures in Old Trang Town/ Tham Le Khao Kob/ Kantang Train Station



09:30 Hrs. - Explore Trang city and see Sino Portuguese architecture scattered around Trang Municipality. These buildings are the perfect combination of East Meets West and are excellent proof of the city's prosperous past.

11:00 Hrs. - Kantang Train Station located on Nah Khai Road in Kantang District features a classic yellow-brown wooden building. It was first opened in 1913 and is the last southern train station on the Andaman side.

12:00 Hrs. - lunch at Koh Libong Restaurant Add: 93/7 Sri Trang Road, Khok Lo, Muang Trang. Tel: +66 83 522 1898

14:00 Hrs. - Tham Lay Khao Kob is located 8 kilometers from Huay Yod District. To enter this fascinating cave, you need to ride on a flat boat as it is a water cave. The inside is filled with beautiful stalagmites and stalactites and there are a total of 23 chambers but only 3 are open to visitors.

18:30 Hrs. - Dinner at Krua Khanitta. Add: 133 Moo 7, Trang-Pattalung Road, Nayong Nua



day 3

Full Day Tour to Tarutao Islands



09:00 Hrs. - Hire a ride to Pak Bara Pier.

10:30 Hrs. - From Pak Bara Pier, enjoy an hour and forty five minute boat ride to Tarutao Island. Tarutao's travel season is from December to April.

13:00 Hrs. - Catch a boat back to Pak Bara Pier.

Satun Central Masjid/ Kuden Mansion/ Tham Phu Pha Petch



09:00 Hrs. - Visit Satun Central Mosque or Masjid Mambang located on Buri Wanit Road. It is a beautiful masjid built in modern Islamic style in 1979 as the original masjid made of wood has deteriorated.

11:00 Hrs. - Kuden Mansion (Satun National Museum) is a classic two-storey building built by Phraya Phuminatphakdi who was governor of Satun in 1902. It served as city hall for a while but today, it is a

12:00 Hrs. - Lunch at Sirada Kitchen in Kuan Don District. Add: 353 Moo 8, Chalung, Muang. Tel: +6686 956 0102 or Fahat Coffee and Restaurant located close to the Central Masjid. Add: 12/7 Buriwanich Road, Piman, Muang. Tel: +6686 498 2642

13:30 Hrs. - Tham Phu Pha Petch is a huge cave (biggest in Thailand and fourth largest in the world) with beautiful stalagmites and stalactites. Evidence such as bones and ancient utensils show that it was inhabited by prehistoric cave men some 3,000 years ago but the cave itself existed approximately 450 million years ago. There are 15 chambers in this cave and it got this name (Diamond Mountain) because when light hits, the interior of the cave would light up like brilliant diamonds. Phu Pha Petch Cave is located in Manang District of Satun.
