LEARNING STRATEGIES

The best strategies and techniques for learning English (continued)

Increase your Vocabulary

- · Choose a vocabulary book.
- Don't worry if you can't understand it the first time.
- Do not check the meaning of words: check how to use them.
- Go over things a second time (review and study).
- Keep going until you remember most of the vocabulary.

Practice at Low Level

- Practicing English at a low level is very important, as understanding difficult material takes a lot of time.
- · Learners need English knowledge input, which means a lot of reading and listening.
- · Choose easy material: studying will be more enjoyable.

Immerse Yourself in English.

- · Go to your teacher's office and ask her to check your English.
- · Have conversations with your teacher.
- · Be positive.
- · Have a partner join you in learning English.

Another Way to Immerse Yourself in English

- · Choose one movie or CD.
- · Watch it and listen to it.
- · Write down sentences and phrases.

Input

- · Watch a movie
- · Listen to music
- Read a book

Output

- · Have conversation
- Write down your ideas

Summary

- · Find your appropriate method.
- · Keep practicing English.
- · Balance the study of all four skills.
- Make time for input
- · Make time for output
- Keep using your English.

Here's the Answer...

Question Tags





- Q: I get confused about how to respond to a tag question with a negative statement. Could you explain?
- A: We answer a tag question according to the **truth** of the situation. Your answer reflects the real facts, not (necessarily) the question.

For example, everyone knows that **snow is white**. Look at these **questions**, and the **correct answers**:

tag question	correct answer		STOO
Snow is white, isn't it? Snow isn't white, is it?	, ,	the answer is the same in both cases - because snow IS WHITE!	but notice the change of stress when the answerer does not agree with the questioner
Snow is black, isn't it? Snow isn't black, is it?		the answer is the same in both cases - because snow IS NOT	
		BLACK!	

In some languages, people answer a question like "Snow isn't black, is it?" with "Yes" (meaning "Yes, I agree with you"). This is the **wrong answer** in English!

Here are some more examples, with correct answers:

- The moon goes round the earth, doesn't it? Yes, it does.
- The earth is bigger than the moon, isn't it? Yes, it is.
- The earth is bigger than the sun, isn't it? **No**, it **isn't**!
- Asian people don't like rice, do they? Yes, they do!
- Elephants live in Europe, don't they? **No**, they **don't!**
- Men don't have babies, do they? No, they don't.
- The English alphabet doesn't have 40 letters, does it? No, it doesn't.
