To support the implementation of Thailand's 20-Year National Strategy (2018 - 2037), which aims to move Thailand towards greater stability, prosperity, and sustainability based on the Sufficiency Economy Philosophy (SEP) and with a key priority to enhance human resource development, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Thailand has developed its own "5S" 20-Year Foreign Affairs Master Plan (2018 - 2037). As the name suggests, the plan has five key strategic priorities, namely: Security, Sustainability, Standard, Status, and Synergy.

The Ministry recognises that human resource development, diplomacy and the ability to cultivate public-private-people partnerships will be fundamental in driving achievements across all five areas. The Devawongse Varopakarn Institute of Foreign Affairs or DVIFA, which serves as Thailand's leading training centre for diplomatic excellence, has a key role in building the core competencies and developing the knowledge and specialised skills that will enable the Ministry to meet its planned objectives. Beyond knowledge and skills, the DVIFA also nurtures people to be caring and responsible.

The DVIFA has a long history. It began in 1967 as the training unit of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, was established as an institute in 1984, and assumed its current name in 2007 when the Ministry was granted permission to adopt the name of His Royal Highness Prince Devawongse Varopakarn, the Father of Thai Diplomacy. These changes in status reflect the Ministry's increasing commitment to human resource development over time.

To realise the DVIFA's vision of being a paragon of diplomatic excellence, the Institute promotes lifelong learning using inclusive, holistic and integrated approaches. Its core mission is to deliver capacity building programmes, language training and testing for foreign service officials at all levels; provide support services to stakeholders in various sectors; as well as manage and disseminate knowledge of diplomacy and international affairs among the Ministry's foreign service officials and other government agencies, the Thai civil service, relevant stakeholders and members of the public.

The Training and Development Division

offers a range of programmes to enhance the core competencies of foreign service officials, officials from other government agencies in Thailand and abroad, and private sector representatives whose work concerns diplomacy, international affairs and foreign policy. The Strategic Research Centre

The Knowledge of Diplomacy and Academic Services

collaborates with the Thai diplomatic missions abroad and foreign diplomatic missions in Thailand to organise open sessions, special lectures, seminars, roundtable talks and discussions on a wide-range of issues related to international affairs, foreign policy, international economics, international law, and regional/international organisations. The DVIFA collates, publishes and disseminates materials from these activities in various formats.

The Language Centre

provides language skills training (English and other foreign languages) both in-house as well as for officials from other government agencies. While the general programmes focus on enhancing overall linguistic proficiency, there are also specific work-related skills courses for example interpreting skills. The Standards and Assessment Centre

adopts an inclusive approach to language testing, ensuring those with physical impairments have equal access to recognised international standard tests. Its portfolio of tests includes two English language proficiency tests, based on the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR), that were developed in collaboration with an internationally renowned testing expert. For the testing of other foreign languages, the Centre liaises with relevant partner institutions and experts. In addition to measuring proficiency, the Centre offers tests to facilitate screening and recruitment processes.

The International Studies Center (ISC)
