Back to where they belong

Example Q0 / All of the items being returned are similar objects.

The second sentence of paragraph 1 tells us that the there are 15 items in this collection. It goes on to say that these items are made from different materials: some are "bronze" and some "pottery". It also tells us that the items serve different purposes: some are "ornaments" and some are "tools".

Therefore the statement in example 0 is **false (F).** We know this from the sentence which begins with the words **The collection, comprising 15**....

Q1 / All the items were found by the Institute at the same time.

In sentence 3 of paragraph 1 we are told that the Institute did an audit "last year" and that during that audit the Ban Chiang collection was rediscovered. However sentence 4 tells us that the Institute "initially found 13 items" and we already know that there are 15 items. The next sentence tells us that the other two items "were located only a few weeks ago".

Therefore the statement in Q1 is **false (F).** There are two possible answers. The first is the sentence which begins with the words "**It initially found 13**" and the second with the words "**Two more items, including**…"

Q2 / The Institute is returning the items because it is the right thing to do.

In the first sentence of paragraph 2 we are told that University College London's decision to "return the collectionwas made for ethical reasons". Doing something for "ethical reasons" means the same as saying "it is the right thing to do".

Therefore the statement in Q2 is **true (T)** and the first four words of the sentence are "**The return of the collection**..."

Q3 / Thailand will pay for transporting the items back to Thailand.

In the final sentence of paragraph 2 we are told that the "collection is to be shipped to Thailand soon" and that UCL is "shouldering the cost". To "shoulder the costs" means the same as to cover the costs.

Therefore the statement in Q3 is **false (F).** The sentence justifying this begins "And it is to..."

Q4 / The finding of Ban Chiang is significant for archeologists.

At the beginning of paragraph 3 we are told that Ban Chiang is "the most important prehistoric settlement in Southeast Asia thus far..." "Thus far" means the same as until now. As "the most important" it must therefore be "significant for archaeologists".

Therefore the statement in Q4 is **true (T).** There are two possible justifications The first is the sentence which begins with the words "Ban Chiang is **considered**..." The second is the sentence which begins "UNESCO placed it on..."

Q5 / A member of the British Embassy wanted to sell the items for a profit.

Paragraph 4 explains how the collection was bought by a "Vientiane-based British diplomat" but goes on to say that he "bought the antiquities", in other words the collection, "for his own interest" and not as "an investment or sale".

Therefore the statement in Q5 is **false (F).** The sentence justifying this begins "The diplomat bought the..."

Q6 / The diplomat gave all the items he had to the archaeologist.

Paragraph 4 also tells us that after learning from Prof Glover that it was "probably illegal and certainly unethical to buy and export such materials", the diplomat decided to give his collection to the Institute of Archeology. However, the items he gave the Institute were only "a very small part of a much bigger collection the diplomat had at that time".

Therefore the statement in Q6 is **false (F).** The sentence justifying this begins "The donated lot is..."

Q7 / Thailand already has many items similar to those being returned.

In paragraph 5 we are told that Thailand "has plenty of larger and more representative yet still unprovenanced antiquities in both national and other local and private museums". "Plenty" is similar in meaning to "many". "Antiquities" are objects from a very long time ago.

Therefore the statement in Q7 is **true (T)**. The sentence justifying this begins "**Prof. Glover said this...**"

Q8 / It is not important how many items are given back.

In a quote from Pisit Charoenwongse, the director of a Thai institute called SEAMEO SPAFA, "the number of the returned artifacts does not count in this matter". "Does not count" means the same as "is not important".

Therefore the statement in Q8 is **true (T).** The sentence justifying this begins **Pisit, a UCL graduate**....
